Note that this method won't work for all videos on every website, especially streaming services like YouTube, Netflix, or Amazon Prime, as these platforms often hide content/download links in their backend code. We recommend using a different browser if your primary/default browser doesn't display video links in the DevTools environment. In some cases, we've encountered instances where a website's video URL was missing in Microsoft Edge's DevTools but visible in Google Chrome. If you're facing a similar issue, try switching to another browser and giving it another shot.
