Zane Grey was an American writer who wrote adventure novels, especially Westerns. He liked to write about the American frontier. His most famous book, *Riders of the Purple Sage*, sold really well in 1912. Alvin Kraenzlein was a super good athlete from America. He set four world records in track and field events at the Olympics in Paris. Nobody else had done that before him! He also invented a new way to run hurdles without bending his legs. Ad Swigler played baseball for a living, but he got hurt and couldn't play anymore. He still played some other sports though. Alfred Bull was another athlete who played football and even coached some teams. He did many things in his life, like rowing and being a dentist! Walter Bernhardt was a good baseball player too. He threw really well for the New York Yankees. Jeffrey Hutter is an American dentist who used to be important in a special dental group. Theodor Blum was super good at helping people with their teeth. He even helped make oral pathology (which is like a medical branch of dentistry) famous as a real job. Robert H. Ivy was a renowned American plastic surgeon who pioneered the team approach in treating children with cleft lip and cleft palate. Born in 1881, he was a pioneer in the specialty of plastic surgery due to his experience during World War I. The "Ivy Loop" technique, used in intermaxillary fixation, is named after him. Aung Than is a celebrated Burmese dentist who is considered the father of Myanmar Dentistry. Born on November 13, 1935, he graduated from the University of Medicine 1, Yangon in 1960 and received his D.D.S. from the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine in 1963. Jay Seibert was an American periodontist who served as a professor and chairman at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine.
