The suffix "-ed" is used to form past tenses and perfect participles in English, coming from Old English "-od" which was derived from Proto-Germanic *-ōdaz. It is also used as an adjective suffix, adding the meaning "having done something" or "contents of". In Hungarian, the suffix "-ed" is used to form the possessive form of a noun (e.g. "kert" becomes "kerted", meaning "your garden"), and in some cases, it forms the definite second-person singular indicative present tense of verbs (e.g. "fest" becomes "fested", meaning "you paint"). The suffix "-ed" also has variant forms depending on the vowel sound preceding it. In English, this is used to form fractions (e.g. "thousand" becomes "ezred"), while in Hungarian, it's used to form frequentative verbs (e.g. "szenvéd" becomes "szenvédett", meaning "to suffer repeatedly"). In addition, the suffix "-ed" has cognates with other languages such as Saterland Frisian, German Low German, Swedish, and Icelandic, among others. Overall, the suffix "-ed" is a versatile morphological marker that serves various purposes in different languages. The suffix "æppel" ("apple") + -ed is used to form the past participle of class I weak verbs, as seen in fremman ("to perform") + -ed becoming fremmed ("performed"). Additionally, -ed is utilized in various contexts: - To create nouns, such as "path" or "loss", by adding -ed to the root word. - To form the plural of words like "bug" or "girl", by appending -ed. - In certain cases, forming an equative of an adjective, like "as weak" or "as cheap". - It can also be used as a suffix in place names, indicating a path between or along water. The origin of the -ed suffix traces back to Proto-Indo-European *-tis or *-tus.
