However, none of these labels made the distribution transition after American Recordings left Warner Bros. Records in 1997. The first Def American release was Reign in Blood by Slayer, which had a Def Jam Recordings logo on its first pressing. Danzig's debut album was also released with the Def American logo. ----- Def American Recordings eventually changed hands and became part of Warner Music Group, and its recordings were deleted from distribution. Warner Bros. Records took over distribution from Geffen Records in the United States, while BMG handled international distribution from 1990 to 1997. Later, Columbia Records distributed American Recordings until 2001, after which Universal Music Group's Island Def Jam Music Group division stepped in. In 2005, Warner Bros. Records regained control of the label, except for Johnny Cash's recordings. The American Recordings catalog was transferred to Sony BMG (now Sony Music Entertainment) in 2007 due to a legal dispute over distribution rights. After a brief stint with Universal Republic Records (now Republic Records), Rick Rubin signed a new deal with them in 2012. During this period, the label's catalog was moved to Universal Music Group, excluding System of a Down and Chino XL's Here To Save You All.
