Believe it or not, Memorial Day weekend is already here, which means the 2025 Boston Calling Music Festival is just around the corner. This year's festival will take place from May 23-25 at the Harvard Athletic Complex in Allston, featuring over 50 artists across three days. The lineup includes country star Luke Combs, alt-rock band Fall Out Boy, and jam band kings Dave Matthews Band headlining Friday, Saturday, and Sunday respectively. To make the most out of your experience, we've put together a guide covering essential information about the festival, including the best artists to see, food options, rules for what not to bring, transportation logistics, and more. One notable change this year is the new layout, which addresses last year's complaints of overcrowding. The Red and Green stages will now be combined into a single rotating stage (The Green Stage), providing better views, more space, and an enhanced audio-video experience. Additionally, the indoor arena will return, allowing festivalgoers to escape the heat or rain while enjoying performances by Berklee College of Music jazz students inside the Bright-Landry Hockey Center. There will also be additional water stations available throughout the festival grounds. The festival grounds open at 1 p.m. each day, with performances starting shortly after. Some notable acts include T-Pain, Megan Moroney, and Sheryl Crow on Friday; The Black Crowes, Avril Lavigne, and Cage the Elephant on Saturday; and Public Enemy, Vampire Weekend, Remi Wolf, and Tom Morello on Sunday. Get ready to rock out with Boston Calling 2025! Boston Calling 2025 will feature local artists, with Bebe Stockwell opening the festival on Friday at 1:30 from the Green Stage. The festival has a strong focus on local acts, with two full stages dedicated to area artists. Other notable local performers include Bad Rabbits and Berklee College of Music jazz students. The festival's food lineup includes over 25 local eateries, such as Sully's Apizza, Flip The Bird, and High Street Place staple Pennypackers. Popular menu options returning to the Boston Calling food lineup for 2025 include dumplings from Dumpling Daughter and barbecue from The Smoke Shop BBQ. Taking the MBTA Red Line to Harvard Station is the most convenient way to reach the festival. From there, follow John F. Kennedy Street, cross the Anderson Memorial Bridge, and look for the festival entrance on the right-hand side of the street. The walk takes approximately ten minutes. If you're not near the Red Line, consider taking the Commuter Rail or bus routes 66 and 86 to Harvard Stadium. Please note that there is no parking available at the festival, and Boston police will be ticketing and towing any vehicles parked in nearby streets illegally. Using a ride-share service like Uber or Lyft is recommended, with pickup areas located at the Harvard Business School on Western Ave. Boston police will also close several nearby streets from 9 p.m. to midnight each night for pedestrian safety, making public transportation an ideal option. To minimize wait times, Boston Calling 2025 is a cashless festival where festivalgoers can register their wristband with a credit or debit card through the festival website. Vendors accept credit cards, but lines are still expected at official artist and merchandise stalls. Familiarize yourself with the festival map before arriving to avoid bottlenecks. The layout may be different from previous years due to the removal of the Red Stage. By exploring the map, you can optimize your route to minimize wait times. 2025 Festival Bags and Prohibited Items Guidelines The festival has adjusted its bag policy for 2025, allowing slightly larger bags as long as they are clear. Small clutch purses and fanny packs measuring 6 x 9 or smaller are permitted. Tickets for Boston Calling 2025 can be pricey, with prices reaching up to \$344. However, secondary ticket resale websites like StubHub often have cheaper options available, although buyers should beware of fake tickets. The festival is set to return on May 23-25, 2025, at the Harvard Athletic Complex in Lower Allston, and promises a fun weekend of live music, comedy, and local food. Boston Calling is an annual all-ages music festival now in its 13th year, produced by C3 Presents. The event typically takes place over Memorial Day Weekend and features a diverse lineup of national and local acts. In 2024, headliners included Ed Sheeran, Tyler Childers, and The Killers. This year's lineup will be announced in January, with ticket sales following suit. Historically, tickets have ranged from \$190 to \$1,400, although organizers have hinted at lower prices for 2025. Boston Calling is not a camping festival, so attendees will need to plan for accommodations if they're not local. The event has grown in popularity since its debut in 2013 and now includes stages focused on local talent, national indie and country acts, as well as comedy and visual arts installations. To enhance the festival experience, Boston Calling is introducing several layout improvements. The Red and Green stages will merge into one epic rotating stage, offering state-of-the-art sound and video for a seamless, immersive experience. Redesigned stage areas will improve crowd flow and ease congestion, while additional water stations will be strategically placed throughout the grounds to ensure hydration is easily accessible. For those looking to take a break from the excitement, the on-site indoor arena will provide a spacious, temperature-controlled space to regroup and recharge. Boston Calling will also host its highly popular GA+ experience this year, with General Admission passholders able to upgrade their ticket for unlimited access to the festival's GA+/VIP Reserve Lounge. The VIP and Platinum experiences have been revamped, offering exclusive viewing areas, upgraded restrooms, and premium amenities such as a cash bar featuring craft cocktails and complimentary water and soft drinks. Platinum pass holders will also enjoy panoramic viewing decks with menus by Boston's best chefs, while being treated to an exclusive hosted bar, daily gifting suite, and daily parking pass. Boston Calling festival has begun with a diverse lineup of artists including Luke Combs, Megan Moroney, Sheryl Crow, T-Pain, TLC, and many others. The event started on Friday, May 23, and the weather is expected to improve throughout the weekend. Tickets are still available for purchase online at bostoncalling.com/tickets, with prices ranging from \$178 for a one-day general admission pass to \$2,899 for a three-day VIP pass. A pleasant weekend is on the horizon, with temperatures gradually increasing. On Sunday, May 25th, expect clearer skies and a high of 61 degrees Fahrenheit in Boston, accompanied by a low of 48 degrees. The following day, Monday, May 26th, is predicted to be the most enjoyable, with AccuWeather forecasting a high of 65 degrees in Boston.
