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Renaming gba games to work with DraStic's slot 2 functionality is deisgned to allow for th handful (I think arond 15 but it is probly less) of games that have eather a feature unlock or transfer from a GBA cart to a NDS game. That is why a Slot 2 GBA game (and posibally relevant save depending on what the NDS game needs) needs to be named either slot2.gba (universal title) or named the same as the NDS rom (to only load that slot2 functionality in that one NDS rom). You can not actualialy play any GBA game in drastic the emulator does not emulate GBA games only NDS games. So both cheats and external and virtual controllrs do not work with the non working GBA games. To explaine step by step please: first you need to rename your gba games to either slot2.gba or named the same as the NDS rom. Then you can put the game into your phone and load it up like a normal Drastic game. However, keep in mind that DraStic does not support cheats for GBA games or external controller support. I know I dont understand what to do because my DS sold long ago but I stil kept my GBA game cartridges that my friends gave me in grade 6 when I stil had my GBA console. I want to play Dragonball Z Legacy of Goku 2, Medabots RPG Metabee, Harvest Moon Friends of Mineral Town and Dragonball Z Buu's Fury. The DS games now have 3D and it looks and feels weird and Im more usd to GBA one screen and the pixel graphics (old times). I wont tell you to get a GBA emulator because the DS has a GBA slot for a reason and this is a DS forum. But DraStic is not like other emulators that can play every function of the console it is based on.Retroarch: A Confusing Emulator for the Discerning Gamer A person was looking for an emulator to play games on their device, but they found it difficult. Drastic is a good option because it's a legitimate emulator, but there are other options available as well. One of these alternatives is retroarch, which can load multiple game systems, including GPSP and VBA-M cores. However, some people do not like the menu system of retroarch due to its complexity and other issues. Additionally, GBA.emu by Robert Broglia is another option that handles certain games well, such as Boktai: the sun is in your hand. The main issue with using retroarch is that it can be slow and confusing, especially when compared to Drastic. This is because retroarch uses a core called ppsspp, which is based on an older version of the original PPSSPP software. However, some people think that this is not a major problem since all multi-system emulators have their own set of issues. For now, using retroarch means putting up with a cluttered and confusing user interface, but it's still worth considering for those looking for a free option.RetroArch remains free due to its open-source nature, allowing it to be compatible with a wide range of platforms. ===== RetroArch has a cluttered UI but is currently being reworked by the developer, while desktop versions offer an improved interface. ===== The developer can be followed on Twitter for updates: ===== There are 291 users online, with 5 registered and 286 guests, and a record of 52195 users at one time. ===== A user is experiencing issues with DraStic, which has moved its save folder to the internal appdata directory. However, since the phone is not rooted, they cannot access it. ===== The developer suggests using the Android Files app or system settings to select a different directory for saves. ===== The latest update for DraStic, compatible with Garlic OS and MinUI, has been released and includes bug fixes. =====I've been using DraStic for a while now, and I'm really enjoying it. I initially purchased it for myself, but I also bought it for two of my friends so we could play together.
