## Twilight saga the official illustrated guide

Stephenie Meyer's life was forever changed on June 2, 2003. As a stay-at-home mother of three young sons, she found herself drawn into a vivid dream featuring characters that lingered in her mind. Despite the demands of caring for her children, she prioritized writing, setting aside time to craft the plot during swim lessons and potty training sessions. Her first novel, *Twilight*, was completed just three months later, and it quickly gained widespread attention, debuting at number 5 on *The New York Times* bestseller list in 2005. The book's success was a remarkable achievement, earning it an "ALA Top Ten Books for Young Adults" award, an Amazon.com "Best Book of the Decade & So Far" designation, and a Publishers Weekly Best Book of the Year nod. Meyer wrote her first novel, *Twilight*, over a period of three months, combining it with activities such as swimming and potty training during the day, and writing at night when the house was quiet. The book became a huge hit, reaching #5 on *The New York Times* bestseller list within weeks of its release in 2005. It received several accolades, including being named one of the top ten books for young adults by ALA, an "Amazon Best Book of the Decade & So Far", and Publishers Weekly's best book of the year. The movie adaptation starring Kristen Stewart and Robert Pattinson was released on November 21, 2008. The sequel, *New Moon*, spent 31 weeks at #1 on *The New York Times* list, while *Eclipse* sold 150,000 copies in its first day. The final book, *Breaking Dawn*, had the largest first printing of 3.2 million copies and sold 1.3 million in its first day, making it a bestseller nationwide. Meyer's subsequent novels for adults, *The Host*, also performed well, debuting at #1 on several lists. My subsequent novels, including *Breaking Dawn* and *The Host*, also achieved significant commercial success. Despite being a debut author for adults, my work has resonated with readers worldwide. My life changed dramatically on June 2nd, 2003, and I have since dedicated myself to creating stories that capture the human experience. Stephenie Meyer had a mountain of tasks to tackle (like cooking breakfast for her hungry little ones and getting everyone dressed and diapered), but she chose to lie in bed thinking about the dream that was still fresh in her mind. Despite not wanting to get up, she eventually rolled out of bed and got busy with the essentials. However, as soon as she had a spare moment, she sat down at her computer to write - something she hadn't done in ages, leaving her wondering why she was bothering. Meyer's creativity actually started coming together during the day while she juggled swim lessons and potty training for her little ones; she'd then type out her ideas late at night when the house was finally quiet. Three months later, she had completed her first novel, *Twilight*. *Twilight* turned out to be one of the most talked-about books in 2005 and within weeks of its release, it debuted at #5 on *The New York Times* bestseller list. Meyer's work received numerous accolades, including being named an "ALA Top Ten Books for Young Adults," an Amazon.com "Best Book of the Decade...So Far", and a Publishers Weekly Best Book of the Year. A movie adaptation of *Twilight* was set to hit theaters nationwide on November 21, 2008, starring Kristen Stewart and Robert Pattinson. Meyer's highly-anticipated sequel, *New Moon*, hit stores in September 2006 and stayed at the #1 position on *The New York Times* bestseller list for 31 weeks. Her third book in the *Twilight* Saga, *Eclipse*, was released on August 7, 2007 and sold an impressive 150,000 copies its first day on sale. The book made it to the top spot on bestseller lists across the country, including *USA Today* and *The Wall Street Journal*. The fourth and final installment of the *Twilight* Saga, *Breaking Dawn*, was published on August 2, 2008 with a record-breaking first printing of 3.2 million copies - the largest in the publisher's history. *Breaking Dawn* flew off the shelves on its release day, selling 1.3 million copies and catapulting to #1 on bestseller lists nationwide. Meyer took some time to focus on writing for adult readers, releasing her debut novel *The Host* by Little, Brown and Company in May 2008, which debuted at #1 on *The New York Times* and *Wall Street Journal* bestseller lists. Stephenie Meyer graduated from Brigham Young University with a degree in English Literature and currently resides in Arizona with her husband and sons. Additionally, Meyer released *The Twilight Saga: The Official Illustrated Guide* (originally titled *The Official Guide*) on April 12, 2011 - an encyclopedic reference book filled with exclusive new material about the world she created in *Twilight*. The guide features nearly a hundred full-color illustrations by artist Young Kim and other talented artists. Given text rewritten as follows: Stephenie Meyer announced in September 2010 that she was still working on her guide to the *Twilight* Saga since 2008. She mentioned that this project is interesting because there were many unauthorized guides circulating with inaccurate information, and it's her mission to correct these errors. In a press release for *The Short Second Life of Bree Tanner*, Meyer revealed that she started writing about Bree when editing *Eclipse*, but it ended up being too long to fit into the guide, so her publisher suggested publishing it as a standalone novella. The Guide is expected to include character profiles, outtakes, conversations with Meyer, genealogical charts, maps, extensive cross-references, and over 100 illustrations and photographs. The release date was initially set for December 30, 2008, but it was postponed indefinitely due to Meyer's involvement in the production of *The Twilight* Saga films. In 2010, rumors circulated about the guide's release date, with some suggesting December 30, while others said it would be released later in the year. In January 2011, Little, Brown Books for Young Readers announced an international fan event where ten fans would win a meeting with Meyer and receive an advance copy of *The Guide*. *USA Today* published a teaser article on March 31, 2011, promoting *The Guide*, followed by an interview the next day that covered the international fan event in Vancouver. In this interview, Meyer mentioned that her favorite part of *The Guide* is the vampire histories, which include new information about characters like Alice and Victoria. The official illustrated guide for *The Twilight Saga* is set to be released in April. ^ Stephenie Meyer revealed that this comprehensive reference book would provide exclusive insights into the world created by her in the series, including nearly a hundred full-color illustrations. The release of *The Guide* was initially set for December 30, 2008, but it was delayed due to Stephenie Meyer's involvement in the production of *The Twilight* Saga films. After several false rumors, Little, Brown Books for Young Readers finally announced that the book would be released later in 2010. To promote *The Guide*, *USA Today* released a teaser article and an interview with Meyer on April 1, which covered her international fan event and her favorite parts of the book. In 2010, the *Twilight* Saga released an official illustrated guide that showcased its iconic characters and storylines. To celebrate this milestone, Stephenie Meyer hosted a fan event in January 2011, which attracted international attention. As the series came to a close, fans were eager to know what was next for author Stephenie Meyer. In March 2011, *USA Today* published an article highlighting Meyer's plans and her dedicated fan base, known as Team Meyer.
