## Dear Potter's House family,

As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with gratitude for the impact that God has made through Potter's House. Our mission to serve poor and at-risk children and youth in Guatemala continued and through faith, dedication and the generosity of our partners, we have been able to provide spiritual resources, education, healthcare and nutrition for those who need them the most.

In 2024 we focused our services, resources, strategies, programs and structure to create a positive and lasting impact over time in the lives of the Treasures and other participants. We were able to serve more than **37,092** Treasures around the country and have seen how God has redeemed and changed lives! **287** Treasures participated in our Education Program and **23 of them graduated from High School.**

In the Eastern and Western regions where girls are taught that they are made to stay home, do house work and care for children, 47% of the students in our education programs are girls, this means we are changing the culture there! We celebrate the fact that for 3 consecutive years there have been **no cases of teenage pregnancies recorded in our Program.**

In the following Annual Report, you will find stories of resilience, hope and testimonies of lives touched and futures brightened. None of this would have been possible without each of us fulfilling our calling as participants in God's plan- **together with Him for Others.**

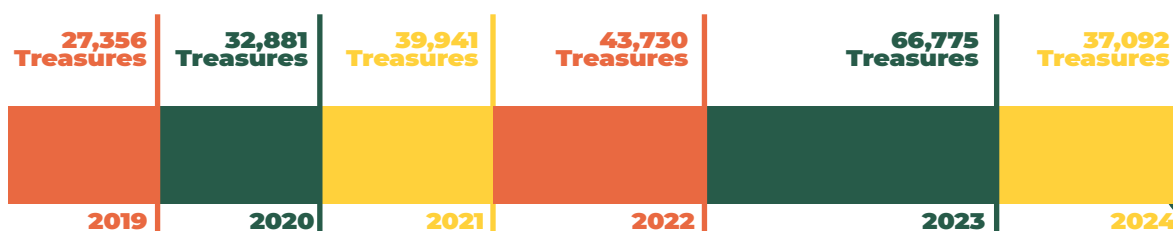

## 8 FORMS OF POVERTY

Although PHA addresses all **8 forms of poverty** and our holistic programs are designed to fight them all, we have understood that to have lasting impact we must focus our services on three:

Spiritual Poverty, Intellectual Poverty and Physical Poverty. The most important of which is **Spiritual Poverty**.

Thus our plans and objectives must reflect this emphasis:

### 2024 General Objective for our Community Centers

Lead Treasures to the improvement of their nutritional status, current analytical capacity and spiritual strengthening.



## Christian Life



- **9** young people **participating in discipleships at PHA went to a mission to Izabal** to serve by evangelizing children and communities.
- **11** young people **lead VBS activities** to share the Good News.
- **33** High School Treasures **shared devotionals** with Elementary Treasures.
- **123** Treasures at a national level began a relationship with Jesus.
- **43 young Treasures** from the Garbage Dump community prayed a prayer of faith.
- **51 Treasures reconciled** their relationship with Jesus.
- **4 evangelistic campaigns** where **705** people heard the message of Salvation and **6 people gave their lives to Jesus**.
- **207 Treasures** read the Bible throughout the year.
- **146 Treasures** memorizing 5 to 12 Bible verses throughout the year.
- **278 Treasures** practicing challenges to learn the Bible.
- In Chiquimula **40% of Treasures promote devotionals at home**.



# Education

Out of **176 Treasures in elementary school**:

- There was an **improvement of 20% in reading and writing proficiency** (from 58pts to 78pts), 61% of the Treasures improved their scores.
- There was a **13% improvement in logical mathematical thinking** (from 45pts to 58pts) and 64% of the Treasures improved their scores.
- 22 Secondary Treasures were tested, and these obtained **72pts in critical thinking**. The challenge in 2025 will be to fine-tune this learning, strengthen it, and pursue the

Out of **287 Treasures in the Education Program at a National Level**:

- **272 Treasures passed their school grade, 5 Treasures failed (1.74%) and 3 deserted their academic studies (1.04%).**

**Central Region, 24 Treasures graduated** from secondary school, out of them:

- **10 Treasures** were exposed to job interviews.
- **15 Treasures** are in the process of registering for university, and **6 have been accepted at USAC** (Public university) to begin their university careers.

**This is the third year with 0 cases of teen pregnancies reported.**



# Nutrition

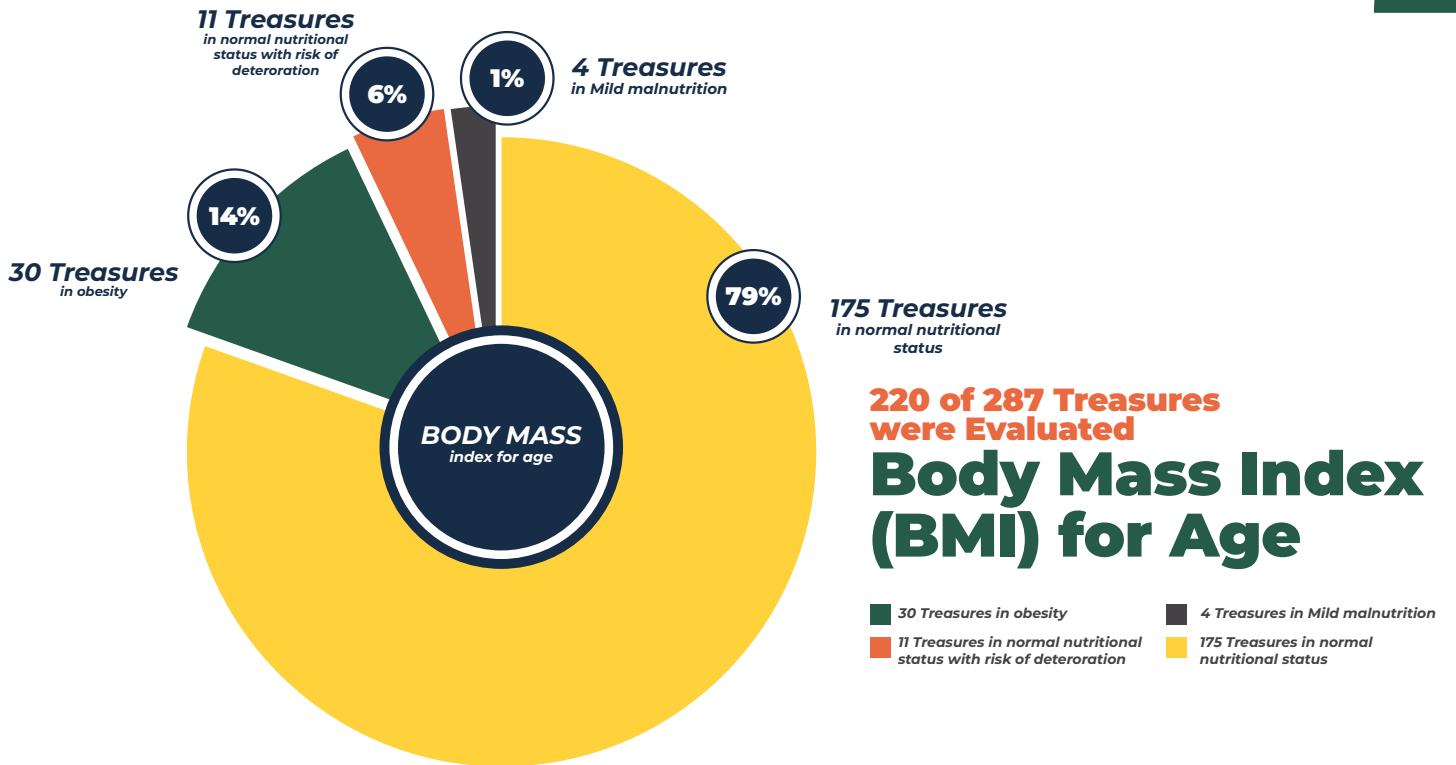
The **287 Treasures** at a national level **increased their physical activity**.

- **25** participated in **soccer training**.
- **175 Treasures grew in height**.
- **166 Treasures** have a **normal weight**.
- **175 Treasures** with **normal body mass indicator**.
- **24 Treasures improved their clinical signs** in hair and skin.
- The goal was that 10 out of 27 Treasures who were overweight would improve their weight, the result was that **3 of them reduced their overweight level**.
- The goal was that 7 out of 13 Treasures who were obese would reduce their levels, the result was that **1 decreased thier body mass indicator**.

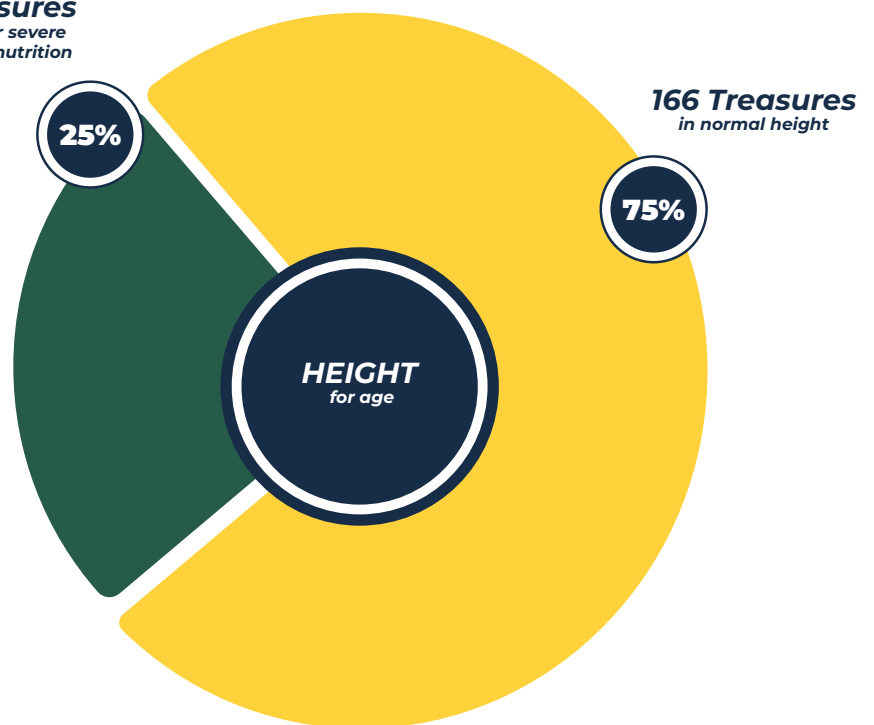

Maria Julia arrived at Potter's House when she was between 7 and 8 years old.

The most difficult experience she has faced was the death of her mother in 2023.

However, Maria Julia has shown courage and a grateful heart toward God, staying focused on His Word.

Maria Julia shares that she identifies with Psalm 27:10. She feels this verse reflects her life because God has never abandoned her, even after her mother's death and her father's abandonment.

Last year, after participating in the Trauma Healing for Adolescents program, she realized she had not forgiven her father. She decided to send him a text message, telling him she forgave him. To her surprise, her father replied, "I am the one who should be asking for your forgiveness." From that day on, God began to heal her heart.

Maria Julia has been a faithful participant in the discipleship program. The meetings have helped her better understand her relationship with God, memorize Bible verses, and for the past two years, she has taken part in the Treasures in Missions program.

*Eastern region*

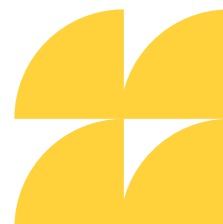
When Eder arrived at Potter's House, his nutritional status was classified as Moderate Chronic Malnutrition. His weight was 19.5 kg, and his height was 112.6 cm.

He and his mother were informed that he needed to gain weight and should eat more fruits, vegetables, and salads to increase the nutrients and calories in his body. His nutritional status also affected his school performance and normal growth.

Eder thanks God for the help he has received at Potter's House since joining the program. He now receives nutritious lunches and the vitamins he needs to reach a healthy weight.

Despite being sick on several occasions, thanks to God, his parents, and Potter's House, his body began to regain the calories necessary to reach a healthy weight and height. Today, he is no longer in a state of Moderate Chronic Malnutrition and has achieved a Normal Nutritional Status. He currently weighs 20.3 kg, and his height is 114.4 cm.
