This Year Marks the 50th anniversary of the Redwoods. Founded by the Community Church of Mill Valley as a nonprofit to meet the needs of area seniors—regardless of their income—the first two residents crossed the threshold and called The Redwoods home on December 3, 1972.

Since that day, The Redwoods has expanded its programs, revitalized its campus, and served literally thousands of seniors and their families. We became known for our relaxed environment, diverse and plentiful programs, classes and activities, as well as our connections with the surrounding community. Extensive outreach efforts, part-

nerships, close working relationships with families, students and community volunteers, and support of social justice causes have made The Redwoods part of the fabric of the community.

Last December 3rd—the first day of our 50th year—we had a wonderful birthday kick-off reception at the Mill Valley Community Church. We'll be celebrating all year and are thrilled to be planning several events leading up to our Anniversary Gala. These include a Mill Valley Sings Choir event at the Throckmorton Theater in late April with our very own Rock the Ages Choir, and the return of the Senior Prom for the residents the evening of November 4th.

# Help Us Power Up

In the Fall Review, we shared our efforts to acquire a new emergency generator that will provide a long-term answer to meeting the electrical power needs of our entire campus. We are delighted to report that the new generator, along with a refillable tank that will hold four days of fuel, has been approved, purchased and is being installed.

"This emergency generator will go a long way in providing security and safety for the moderate and low-income residents we serve, as well as provide a safe haven for residents in the surrounding community, in the event of planned outages during wildfire season and other emergencies," explained CEO Hunter Moore.

Originally estimated at \$500,000, fundraising efforts are underway

to raise the balance needed to purchase and install the generator, the cost of which has increased to \$1.2 million due to regulatory requirements, supply chain challenges and increased demands for emergency power in our area. "We've been fortunate to have
