CARING FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

THE REDWOODS has a history of being good stewards of the residents in our care. We also take our responsibility for caring for the environment very seriously. We continually find ways to reduce our use of all sources of energy and water consumption and in recent years we were certified by Marin County as a Marin Green Business. As part of our revitalization projects, we made significant efforts to retain and properly filter any runoff from our property.

Residents regularly monitor and publish our energy and water uses in our monthly resident newsletter, the BARK, and we have also held events to help reduce, reuse and recycle materials and worked closely with the City of Mill Valley

Reducing Water Use

The Redwoods is now working closely with the Marin Municipal Water District and a water use consultant to continue to find ways to reduce our use of water by converting some of our existing lawns to drought-resistant landscaping. As part of this effort, we will be installing informational signage and associated literature that we hope will inspire area residents to adopt some of these practices on their own properties.


