

Why Wisdom Teeth Can Cause Problems

For example, if the wisdom teeth are likely to crowd the rest of the mouth, we can provide timely referrals to trusted oral surgeons for further evaluation and care.

The Best Age for Wisdom Tooth Evaluation

While there's no one-size-fits-all timeline, we typically recommend evaluating wisdom teeth around ages 15 to 17. This allows us to see how the teeth are forming and whether they're likely to erupt properly. Each child's growth pattern is unique, so timing depends on the individual's dental development and jaw structure. Starting evaluations early gives our dentists time to monitor the situation and make recommendations at the most appropriate stage.

During these evaluations, we also look at the spacing and position of other teeth. If your child is undergoing <u>expanders or pre-orthodontia</u> treatment, the relationship between their wisdom teeth and overall dental alignment is particularly important. Signs Your Child May Need an Early Evaluation

Some children may need their wisdom teeth evaluated sooner than others. While regular exams are the best way to monitor progress, there are signs that can indicate potential problems:

- Jaw pain or pressure toward the back of the mouth
- Swelling or tenderness in the gums near the molars
- Difficulty opening the mouth fully
- Persistent bad breath or an unpleasant taste

Crowding or shifting of other teeth

If any of these symptoms occur, we may recommend additional imaging and a more thorough evaluation. In some cases, impacted or partially erupted teeth can trap food and bacteria, increasing the risk of decay or infection. When that happens, preventive solutions like <u>sealants</u> or professional cleaning may be recommended as part of your child's ongoing care plan.
