Contact us during business hours. This is not usually an emergency and in most cases, no treatment is necessary. DO NOT reinsert the tooth.

Contact Us During Business Hours

In most cases, a knocked out baby tooth is not an emergency. Call us during business hours to make an appointment. We can see if your child has any other issues or additional injuries due to the knocked out tooth.

Do Not Reinsert the Baby Tooth

Unlike adult teeth, baby teeth **SHOULD NOT** be reinserted. **It becomes a choking hazard** and will not reattach itself like an adult tooth would. Keep your child safe and do not try to reinsert the tooth.

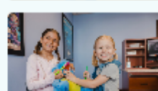

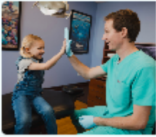
