# About the halow Project About SIME Gallery



SIME Gallery is a gallery that houses some of Sime's artwork. It opened in 1956 and it's located in Worplesdon Memorial Hall.

There are 88 pieces of art work on display.

There are different styles of art work such as oil paintings, water colour sketches, drawings and caricatures.



The halow Project is a charity that was created to support young adults with learning disabilities.

It was set up in 2006.

Halow has different supports such as A Reason To Get Up, Building Futures, Independent Support Programme, Social Activities and more.

halow supports young adults to work on their goals and develop their independence and confidence.

CG have been coming to SIME Gallery on a 4 week project called 'Our Favourite Things' learning about Sidney Sime and recreating some of his art pieces.

## How did you and Haidee become involved with SIME Gallery?

Jan had lived in Worplesdon for a long time and was a trustee at the hall.

Haidee has been working with the SIME Gallery for 3 years on a community engagement project which is funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. "Our Favourite Things" art sessions with halow was arranged by Haidee from the Surrey Museums and Surrey Heritage partnership.

## How is the gallery funded?

By visitor donations, grants and lottery funding.

## Can anyone come to the gallery or is it for education only?

Anyone can come when we're open on Wednesday and Sunday afternoons. The gallery's on the first floor.

## How many times do staff clean the paintings?

Cleaned by specialists and donations are needed.

### Where is Sidney's other artwork other than the gallery?

There's a few fantasy art pieces in Dunsany castle in Ireland and some in private collections, SIME Gallery Worplesdon has the largest collection of Sidney's artwork.

Fantasy oil piece, but to SIME Gallery trustees all the work is priceless!

## **More About Our Favourite Things Project**

**Inspiration and Ideas** In the first session, we visited the Sime Gallery and looked at Sidney Sime's artwork to start getting inspiration and ideas. We also asked Jan from the gallery questions about the art. Afterwards, we talked about which was our favourite and why, how it made us feel, and what we wanted to do for our own art. This helped us plan what we needed next like paints or pencils or laptops.

**Starting Our Art** In the second session, we took a picture of Sime's work and then started our own. We had different resources like watercolours, colour pencils, oil pencils, or sketching pencils as well as different types of paper to try. We talked about our art and what we were creating. We also thought about research questions we wanted to find out about the art and the gallery from Jan for the next session.

**Developing Our Art** In the third session, some of us wanted to continue our art from Session 2 and some wanted that as a draft and to work on a new improved piece. We had an artist join us who helped with ideas and skills in painting and drawing techniques. We also started interviewing Jan about our research questions.

**Final Touches!** In our last session, we did a mix of things. We finished off Our Favourite Things artwork, mounted it on card, finished our questions, made sure Megan had photos of the Sime art and our art. It was fun and busy and everyone got all their Favourite Things finished. After that, we just enjoyed drawing or painting whatever we wanted.

The Newsletter In the first session, we agreed as a group that a great way to share everyone's work would be in the halow newsletter. Megan took this on as its editor. She planned with Haidee and halow and they figured out a brief for the newsletter, deciding the design, information and headings. Megan then continued to work on this over the weeks, getting information and artwork from the group as it was finished. You are reading the result!
