

2% Is Not Enough



We kicked off a new fiscal year on July 1, and August brings a clear reminder of the road ahead. Women's and girls' nonprofits receive less than 2% of total philanthropic giving, leaving us consistently underfunded despite our vital work.

Recent months brought political upheaval and frozen funding, forcing us to close <u>close both Family Reunification programs</u>. *Then our community acted*. You organized, contributed resources, and refused to let these services disappear.

We reopened both programs in May at reduced capacity, meaning hundreds more children can now live safely with their families.

We refuse to surrender. Solidarity means daily action, not just words. For over 50 years, TWB has stood firm against every attack meant to weaken us. As we continue to navigate uncertain policies, we remember: our fight is long, but our power is stronger.



This event reminded us that survival is not a solo act. It takes connection, courage, and the ongoing work of building spaces where all of us can live with dignity.

SanArte Continues!

Launched in May, <u>SanArte</u> creates space for Latina immigrant women to gather for healing, connection, and collective care in response to ongoing anti-immigrant policies. Join us this month:

Hilando Resistencias begins August 29 at 4 PM.

In this 8-session series, participants will reflect on their experiences as Latina immigrants in the U.S. and use embroidery and textile arts to reclaim memory, resistance, and self-expression.

Poner El Cuerpo o el Futuro ya es Feminista. Starting September 8 at 4 PM, Iliana Olalde, Mexican artist and feminist, will guide a 5-session collective creation lab centered on care, somatic practices, body awareness, and political reflection through movement, drawing, and vocal resonance.
