Feminist Art in Action

September 8 to 12, we hosted *Poner el Cuerpo o el Futuro ya es Feminista*, a free collective art workshop led by Mexican feminist artist <u>Iliana Olalde</u>. Through five sessions of somatic practices, painting, gesture, and voice, participants explored the body as a site of memory, care, and resistance.

Over 10 hours of shared creation, the group co-authored a **feminist banner** that will soon be displayed in TWB as a living testament to our stories and power.










We thank Iliana for her generous collaboration and for reminding us that **feminist art** is not only expression, it **is action, connection, and collective memory**!

On Monday Sept 29, our compañera Maria Arteaga, Manager of Dev and Comms at TWB, joined an inspiring live conversation with Iliana Olalde and Vekis Morales from La Revuelta. Together they reflected on sowing possible futures where care and collective strength prevail. This dialogue was part of The Arts for the Future Festival during the UN Summit of the Future and Climate Week.



Earlier that week on Sept 26, for International Safe Abortion Day, Maria also represented us in the Permanent Seminar Sexual and Reproductive Justice: Plural Dialogues from a Feminist Perspective. She spoke on a panel about the rise of the right across the Americas and how it threatens our autonomy — and how we respond by organizing through collective feminism.



Stitching Stories of Strength
