I don't know how many know this, but I was "The Last Man off the McCaffery" when they towed her out of Mayport Harbor. Yes, it was a very sad day, and I remember feeling like I had just lost my best friend. There was no sound, as all the fan motors were shut down, no engine sounds, no radar rotating, nothing. It was truly a dead ship. We were about halfway out of the breakwater when a Navy Harbor tug came alongside and if I recall correctly there were three of us and I'll be damned if I can recall who the others were, but I was the last one off. Still, she still looked good and was ready to take on the world. There were 10 of us that were assigned to the decommissioning crew. Our duties were limited to signing people from other ships onboard for the purpose of removing parts from the MAC for their respective ships. Quarterdeck watches were stood in dungarees.

There was only electrical power to the lights for the ship and for flushing toilets, that was it. It was sad to watch her being slowly stripped away. But then, she lived on, giving life to other ships of the line. As long as she is remembered she will never die. I wish they would christen another McCAFFERY. I wonder how many would show up for the ceremony!
