Mission Statement and Vision

Mission

Mary's mission is to be the UK's leading Serious Youth Violence charity

Vision

Mary's vision is to be a specialist beacon for vulnerable young people affected by serious youth violence.

Purpose

Mary's purpose is to save lives impacted by trauma and violence so that young people can achieve their greatness.



Who we are:

Mary's is an independent charity for young people. We reach vulnerable young people at high risk of violence and exploitation.

Our principles:

A holistic approach which follows the person through the system and their lives.

Mary's commitment is to provide consistency, continuity and a focus on seeing and knowing the young person. This includes our commitment to continuity around the clock: being there when the young person needs us, operating a 24hr/365 day model.

Therapeutic person-centred care. Attachment theory underpins all of Mary's work. Mary's helps a young person addressing the problems they face from a fundamental understanding of the way a young person thinks and connects to others.

Belonging


Mary's promotes a sense of belonging for young people. Young people often perceive this as unconditional belonging. Young people describe Mary's as feeling like family.








The Past 5 Years

Rationale & Assumptions

Rationale: Cohorts, demographics and life experiences of Mary's young people is underrepresented within policy making and primary research. Contextually effective practice and coproduction vital. 


