'CROUCH'ING TIGER

We have all heard or read about now the death of Amanda Thompson on S. Ogden in the city of Buffalo and we all know who is primarily responsible for that death. The question that can be raised now is could this senseless tragedy have been stopped in the first place. The "alleged" defendant was out on bail after being arrested for an armed home invasion at the same address and a firearm was recovered after the defendant fled from a traffic stop. That same defendant was arrested two days later for violating the order of protection that was in effect and was subsequently released again on his own recognizance. The same judge on both incidents.

If the same facts of the case remain and an officer was derelict in his duties, whether failing to respond to the incident in a timely manner, failure to report the incident or failure to appropriately apprehend the subject, the officers and the department becomes under immense scrutiny. 911 calls will be FOILed. Interviews will be held. Internal affairs becomes involved. Body camera footage would be made public for every officer that was involved and those officers are most likely going to be riding the pine while an internal investigation takes place. And of course the same activists we know and love would be coming out of the woodwork again calling for accountability.



But in this instance police responded and quickly and swiftly made an arrest. The correct people were notified to investigate and made everyone aware what this defendant was capable of. Every officer involved could see the writing on the wall but the fact of the matter is police are the only profession in which our word and actions are not to be trusted according to the court of public opin-

ion. We are the only profession in the country that is scrutinized so severely that they had to place cameras on our chests so they can fact check our own testimony. Imagine any other profession where there will be camera footage at all times that you could look back over if you believe you were mistreated or misguided. How many times have you or someone you know gone to the doctor's office and been misdiagnosed because the doctor seemingly does not believe what you are telling them? But yet we trust them because they have the most independent knowledge and expertise to help you.

Now, how many times are police officers going to see violent criminals be let out of prison when we, who are the experts in this realm, are screaming from the rooftops to keep them in prison because we know through our experiences these kind of individuals are dangerous. We believed after Adam Bennefield and Andre Whigham that the courts would protect these women from violence but it always returns to the same place and that place is leniency on criminals. We've heard the word "accountability" so many times now in the course of our duties, so who is going to be accountable for the death of Amanda Thompson?




















MOVING FORWARD By ... MATTHEW CROSS

As much as policing has changed in the last decade with bail reforms and some public sentiments vilifying our every action, often tying the hands of policing and its officers, it is still the best job in the world. Most officers would not function well in a normal 9-5 desk job. For us every single day is different and we go into work not knowing what the day has in store for us. Our office is a patrol car and that gives us all the freedom in the world. It is one of the most unique professions out there and we can make an impact every day while we are performing it. Yes there are long days that are exhausting, whether it is someone yelling their frustrations at you or someone having their phone out and recording your every move. It is no matter to them that we are now required to wear body cameras and they're often too dense to understand that we're already recording our every move on every single call. It is STILL the best job in the world. We get to help people every day and also have the freedom to drive around doing whatever we want to best help the community. As a kid you probably played "Cops and Robbers" with your friends and siblings, and a majority of kids don't get to grow up and do it as a job.



Being a police officer in the City of Buffalo and taking an oath to protect and serve this specific community comes with a certain nobility to it. Other agencies and police officers in the surrounding areas often won't see over their entire career what we see in a typical work week. The adrenaline rush you experience while responding to high priority calls is like no other. Giving chase to a fleeing suspect over fences in the dark, going

to shots fired calls, chasing a car from a recently committed violent felony, or just doing "routine police work" is bred in all of us and it's what separates us from normal everyday workers.
