Susan

Susan, pressured to earn money for her family, fell victim to sex trafficking while seeking a job opportunity in Kenya. Through a mutual friend's connection, Susan was promised a job with better pay and improved working conditions.

Excitedly, she packed her belongings and bid farewell to her beloved mother. When she reached the pick-up point, Susan realized she was accompanied by 15 other girls the same age; they were all being sold into sex trafficking by the UK mafia.

Thankfully, Susan and the other girls were rescued, and soon Susan was introduced to our partners at era92, where she found a caring community and opportunities that she had never dreamed of.

Traumatized, she struggled to trust but found solace in our Elevate program. This program equipped her with the internationally marketable skill of graphic design. Now, she earns money through her designs, supporting her family and advocating against trafficking. Her journey, though difficult, inspires hope for a better future.

AMBULANCE

Baby Lucas

Baby Lucas narrowly escaped death, but thanks to the purchase of the new ambulance in 2023 9-month-old Lucas' precious life was saved! The team received a call that baby Lucas was rushed to Lyantonde hospital with convulsions, and was in a critical condition. Upon treatment, the baby was not responding and needed a referral to Bulamu Medical Center.

Thankfully, our fully equipped ambulance was readily available at the medical center. The team quickly responded, retrieved Baby Lucas, who had dangerously low oxygen levels at 45%, was unresponsive, and struggled to breathe with severe chest retractions and convulsions. Fortunately, Lucas was administered oxygen in the ambulance as he was rushed to Bulamu Medical Center's ICU where he was swiftly tended to.

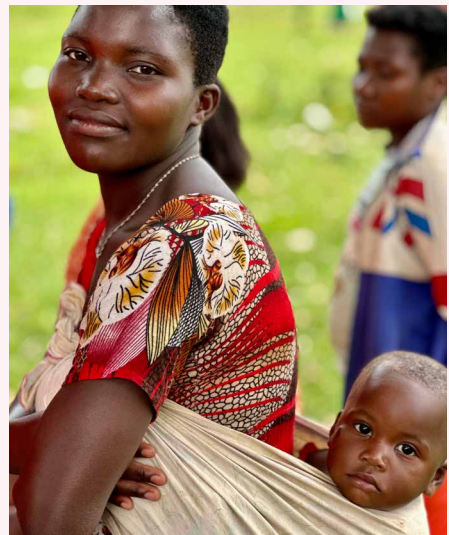
We thank God for this ambulance making it possible for us to save lives and have an immediate response with no delay. Had it not been for the ambulance, Baby Lucas, and many other lives would not have been saved.



Gloria

Gloria, a 13-year-old teen mom, was found with dangerously high blood pressure indicating pre-eclampsia. Thankfully, she did not have to wait for an ambulance since we had purchased a private ambulance in 2023. Rushed to Lubaga Hospital, she was diagnosed with severe pre-eclampsia requiring an emergency Cesarean section.

Despite the critical situation, both mother and baby girl had a safe delivery. Currently, they are under observation in the hospital and expected to be discharged soon. Grateful for their lives, we continue to find ways we can partner to obtain life saving tools such as the ambulance.

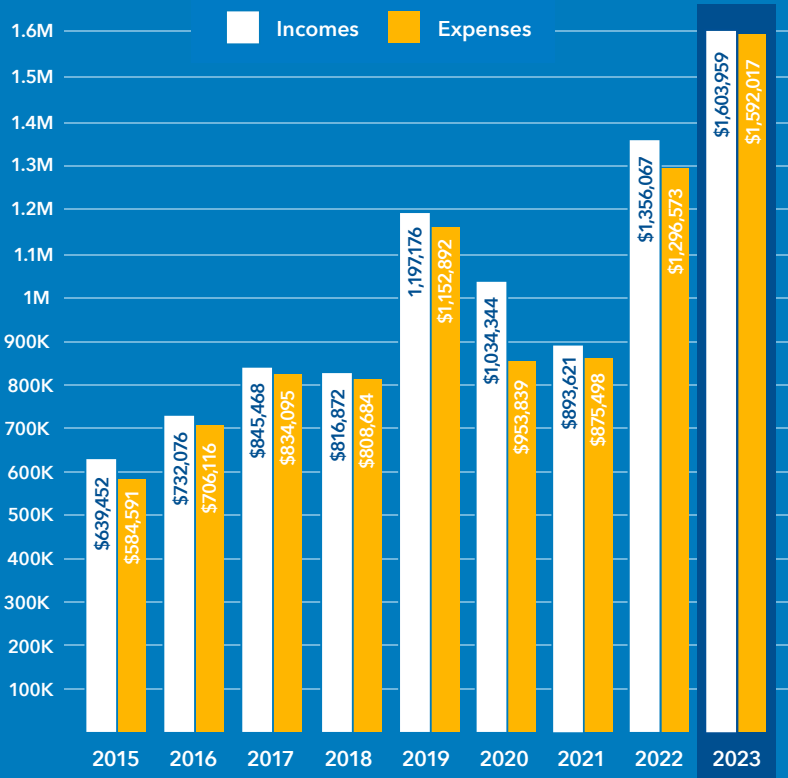

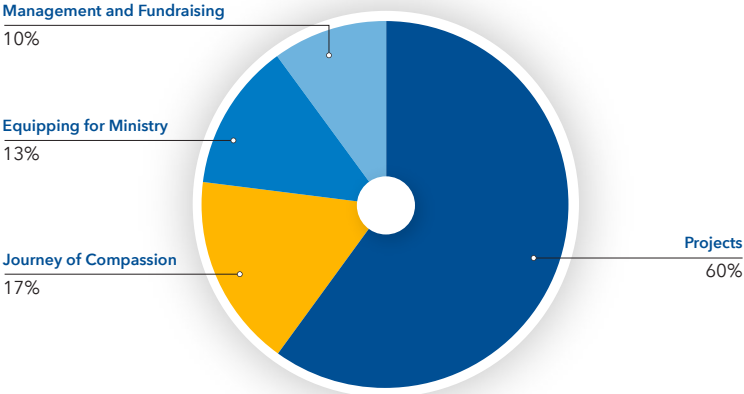
