

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

From our missionaries Anthony and Soyoung Sellari:

May grace and peace be with you in Cairo! Thank you so much for your continued prayers and support while we serve in Egypt.

It's hot summer here again (temperatures are over 107 degrees Fahrenheit and 85 degrees Fahrenheit at night). I want to update you on what's happening here. Soyoung and I lead Bible studies three times a week (not counting Soyoung's two 1-1 Bible trainings), which is a great blessing. Usually, 3-8 people gather in a group, read a chapter of the Bible, share their thoughts on the chapter, and find answers to questions. We share our thoughts for 2 hours.

Unlike lecture style Bible studies, it requires us (those who attend) to think for ourselves, which helps us not forget what we've learned, and apply it to our lives. We (and the Holy Spirit) told ourselves we should do it after all. Not someone telling us what to do.

Soyoung is in charge of all the worship services while the senior pastor of our church is away for a month. We have a very tight schedule, including leading daily prayer meetings, Friday services, Sunday services, Saturday dawn services (5:30 am), and 1:1 discipleship, home visits, and new believer education. We continue to send food boxes (for 300 households) to Syrian and Sudanese refugees every month.

In addition, we continue to provide scholarships (15 or more children) once a year to Sudanese school students. They cannot attend public schools, and their average annual income of \$2,000 per household is not enough. I can't tell you the names of the groups here, but there are several groups of Muslims who have converted to Christianity, and we are also helping them. The church leaders we work with train them and hold retreats to encourage them to seek the Lord more firmly.

We also support a farm (no name). There, we also support those who newly share our faith in Jesus and have been rejected by their families as a result. The ones on the farm raise chickens and sell fresh eggs to make a living. These are primary source of eggs, actually.

We are praying for wisdom so that God's grace can flow to places where it is needed more through the Good Samaritan ministry. During the recent missile attack by Iran, our church members provided temporary shelter for a few days for temporary refugees who came overland from Israel. This is the third time since we came here (2019) that we have accepted refugees from three conflicts involving Israel.

It seems to be the eighth armed conflict that Israel has been involved in in the past six years. I know that many people have been praying for peace in the Middle East for a long time, but I continue to pray that God's kingdom will bring peace here. I think many problems will disappear if everyone finds the peace and love of Christ. Actually, this letter took me a while to write. During that time the war in Israel quieted down (Alhamdulilah! Praise be to God!) and they have since returned to Israel.

Please pray for: wisdom and vitality in leading Bible studies and discipling new believers. For Sudanese refugee families to meet Jesus and stay with Him. For the continued unity and vision of our ministry team. Thank you for your support and prayers!

FIRST READING: Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-23

The teacher of wisdom who wrote Ecclesiastes sees that working for mere accumulation of wealth turns life into an empty game, a "vanity of vanities." Nevertheless, he asserts in the next verse, it is good to find enjoyment in one's work because such enjoyment is a gift from God.

² Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

¹² I, the Teacher, when king over Israel in Jerusalem, ¹³ applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to human beings to be busy with. ¹⁴ I saw all the deeds that are done under the sun; and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

^{2:18} I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to those who come after me ¹⁹—and who knows whether they will be wise or foolish? Yet they will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. ²⁰ So I turned and gave my heart up to despair concerning all the toil of my labors under the sun, ²¹ because sometimes one who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave all to be enjoyed by another who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. ²² What do mortals get from all the toil and strain with which they toil under the sun? ²³ For all their days are full of pain, and their work is a vexation; even at night their minds do not rest. This also is vanity.

SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1-11

Life in Christ includes a radical reorientation of our values. Just as the newly baptized shed their old clothes and put on new garments, so Christians are called to let go of greed and take hold of a life shaped by God's love in Christ.

¹ So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, ³ for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

⁵ Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. ⁷ These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. ⁸ But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. ¹¹ In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

SERMON READING: Acts 4:1-13

Peter and John Before the Sanhedrin

4 The priests and the captain of the temple guard and the Sadducees came up to Peter and John while they were speaking to the people. ² They were greatly disturbed because the apostles were teaching the people, proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead. ³ They seized Peter and John and, because it was evening, they put them in jail until the next day. ⁴ But many who heard the message believed; so the number of men who believed grew to about five thousand.

⁵ The next day the rulers, the elders and the teachers of the law met in Jerusalem. ⁶ Annas the high priest was there, and so were Caiaphas, John, Alexander and others of the high priest's family. ⁷ They had Peter and John brought before them and began to question them: "By what power or what name did you do this?"

⁸ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them: "Rulers and elders of the people! ⁹ If we are being called to account today for an act of kindness shown to a man who was lame and are being asked how he was healed, ¹⁰ then know this, you and all the people of Israel: It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead, that this man stands before you healed. ¹¹ Jesus is

"the stone you builders rejected, which has become the cornerstone."

¹² Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved."

¹³ When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.
