Athru Annacoona 14yr (County Sligo)

\$38.00

Matured for 11 years in ex bourbon American oak casks and then finished for three years in Pedro Ximenez and Oloroso sherry casks. Notes: A rich, sweet whiskey. Salted caramel and forest fruits with dark chocolate finish.

Athru Keshcorran (County Sligo)

\$36.00

Honeyed melon, orange, brown sugar, cinnamon, ginger, a touch of strawberry liquorice laces. Finish Toffee, melted butter, more strawberry sweeties.

Athru Knocknarea (County Sligo)

\$32.00

A 14-Year-Old single malt that was aged in ex-bourbon barrels before being finished in the finest Oloroso Sherry casks for three years. This results in flavours of dried fruit, caramelised sugar and rich mince pies.

Athru Small Batch (County Sligo)

\$24.00

A rich and complex flavor profile with notes of vanilla, honey, dried fruits, and oak spice. It has a smooth and creamy texture with a long, satisfying finish.

Black Emerald 7 Year Old Rum Cask Finish

\$20.00

Aromas of toasted coconut, tropical fruit and oak lead into a vibrant palate of milk chocolate, citrus and soft spice. The finish is smooth and lingering, with notes of banana and coconut leaving a rich, tropical impression.

Black Emerald 15 Year Old Cognac Cask Finish

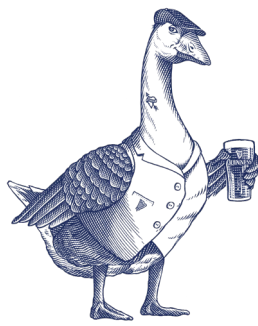

Rich vanilla bean, cherry sweetness and burnt caramel open onto a complex palate of dark chocolate, dried fruits and warming spice. The finish is long, smooth and satisfying, with layers of cognac influence lingering on the palate.

Blacks Single Malt IPA Cask (County Cork)

\$20.00

Smooth Irish whiskey with bold layers of citrus hops, roasted malt, toffee, and dark chocolate, finished in IPA and stout barrels.



Blacks Stout 8yr Worlds End Imperial Stout (County Cork) \$22.00

Layers of dark chocolate, roasted coffee, and toffee sweetness, complemented by subtle hints of vanilla and oak. Finished in Imperial Stout casks, it delivers a velvety texture with lingering notes of malt and a touch of dark fruit

Bushmills Black Bush (Antrim, Northern Ireland) \$14.00

Combines a high amount of malt whiskey matured in former Oloroso Sherry casks, with a sweet, batch-distilled grain whiskey. This unique recipe means Black Bush has rich, fruity notes and a deep intense character, balanced by an incredibly unique smoothness.

Bushmills 10yr (Antrim, Northern Ireland) \$14.00

A smooth and versatile triple distilled blend. An approachable whiskey which has been matured in both bourbon and sherry casks resulting in fresh fruit and vanilla notes.

Bushmills 14yr (Antrim, Northern Ireland) \$16.00

First matured in bourbon barrels and finished in Malaga casks, this single malt opens with honey, vanilla, and toasted oak, layered with dried apricot, sultana, and candied citrus. Hints of nutmeg and dark chocolate carry through to a smooth, warming finish.

Bushmills 16yr (Antrim, Northern Ireland) \$24.00

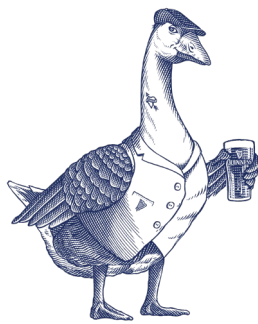
Aged for 16 years in a combination of Oloroso Sherry and Bourbon-seasoned casks, then matured for several months in port wine barrels. The unique maturation process gives this single malt its distinct notes of juicy fruits, nuts and spices, as well as a hint of ruby redness.

Bushmills 21yr (Antrim, Northern Ireland) \$42.00

Rich nose of coffee, honey, spiced fruit and a touch of dark mocha. Palate starts with Chewy, dates, pecans, grapes and mango. The overall finish of sweet & syrupy pipe tobacco and mint.

Bushmills Sherry Steamship (Antrim, Northern Ireland) \$22.00

A rich, sherry-cask-finished whiskey with deep fruit notes and smooth character. Maple syrup and light oak with a long rich and smooth finish.



Busker Single Pot Still (County Carlow, Ireland) \$14.00

Rich fudge, fig, honeysuckle, citrus and tarte tatin. Dark spices, resinous oak and white pepper.

Clonakilty \$16.00

Tasting notes a rich, sweet aroma with notes of vanilla, toffee, and honey. On the palate smooth and mellow, with flavors of caramel, spice, and a hint of smoke.

Clontarf Black label (Dublin, Ireland) \$14.00

Deep amber in colour. Toffee and subtle oak on the nose. The palate is smooth and velvety though slightly shortish. A typical Irish whisky. Aged in Bourbon barrels and mellowed through Irish oak charcoal.

Connemara (Connemara, Ireland) \$16.00

Full and smooth with notes of malt and peat, honeyed smoke and barley sweetness. Long and pungent with honey and peat smoke.

Dead Rabbit (Dublin, Ireland) \$15.00

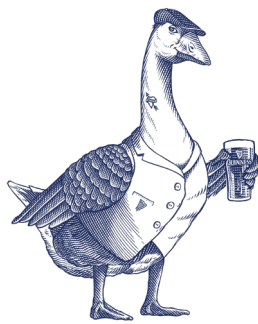
Caramel and vanilla sit up front, with notes of nutmeg, milky coffee and macadamia developing in the background. Lingering waxy fruit and a tickle of black pepper.

Dingle Samhain Single Malt (Kerry, Ireland) \$20.00

Matured in Bourbon casks with a Muscatel cask finish, Samhain Single Malt expresses warm floral, citrus, and cherry notes on the nose. The palate is zesty with hints of raisins, almonds, sweet spice, and raspberry, concluding with a long finish of summer fruits, pepper and cinnamon spice.

Dingle Single Pot Still Irish Whiskey \$22.00

Gentle baking spices, nutmeg and cinnamon open into a velvety palate of dark fruits, brown sugar and spiced stewed apples. The finish brings classic pot-still spice with toasted oak, soft honey and lingering nutmeg.



Dingle Single Malt Irish Whiskey \$22.00

Fresh aromas of zesty lime, mint, vanilla and caramel lead to a palate of caramelised apple, raspberry and rich fruit cake. A lingering finish of honey and soft spice completes this smooth, fruit-forward whiskey.

Dingle Single Malt Pot Still Batch #5 \$26.00

Matured exclusively in bourbon barrels. With notes of red berries on the palate giving way to chocolate and light chilli.

Dingle Small Batch (Kerry, Ireland) \$26.00

Nose of fresh lime zest, mint & sweet Pear. Flavours of caramelised apple, raisins, vanilla and Mixed Spice.

Dingle Single Malt 10yo Irish Whiskey \$28.00

Rich dark fruits and stewed plums lead into a luscious palate of gingernut biscuit and Black Forest gâteau. The finish is smooth and warming, with butterscotch, orange blossom and evolving fruity spice.

Dingle Single Malt Cask Strength Batch #6 \$30.00

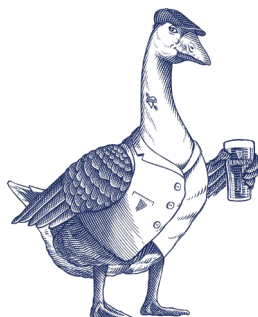
Fully matured exclusively in Tawny Port Casks, Batch 6 is a great example of the interaction between Single Malt spirit and Fortified wine. A whiskey with multiple layers of sweetness and a well-balanced depth of flavour

Dingle 'Lunasa' Single Malt (Kerry, Ireland) \$24.00

Matured in first-fill bourbon casks before a long finish in Widow Jane bourbon casks. Rich and warming with notes of ripe stone fruit, honeyed malt, and toasted oak, unfolding into gentle spice and vanilla on a smooth, lingering finish.

Dingle 'Fomhair' Single Malt (Kerry, Ireland) \$24.00

Matured in first-fill bourbon casks before a long finish in rum casks. Aromas of fresh mint, rhubarb crumbled with brown sugar and toffee apple lead into tropical fruits, sweet raisins, honey and hazelnut, ending in a clean, warming finish with spiced fruits and warm caramel.



Drumshanbo Shed Single Pot \$16.00

Pear drops, dried fruits and apricots. A medium bodied, fruity, juicy, clean spirit that finishes creamy, genteel yet vibrant, showing pitch perfect sweet-dry balance and hints of Bounty bar through the aftertaste.

Drumshanbo Galanta Single Pot \$22.00

Rich and balanced profile with notes of golden caramel, honey, roasted nuts, and sweet apple, complemented by a warm spice finish, all from being aged in single-use Kentucky Bourbon casks.

Egan's Bonders Blend \$16.00

Aromas of spice, butter, coconut and clove lead into a sweet, nutty palate with notes of crème brûlée, vanilla and fudge. The finish is warm and creamy, with gentle woody undertones and a hint of dried fruit.

Egan's Fortitude \$18.00

Rich aromas of red sherry, honey, raisins and marzipan set the stage for a complex palate layered with sherry-soaked fruits, sultanas and dried raisins. The finish is long and satisfying, with the whisky's rich fruit and spice notes lingering beautifully.

Egan's Endeavour \$18.00

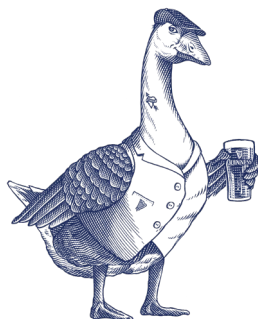
Vanilla sweetness, Earl Grey tea and dried dark fruits are complemented by hints of warm tar on the nose. Rich toffee, chocolate and walnut flavours unfold over a gentle peat influence, leading to a long, peppery finish with lingering tannins.

Egan's Vintage Grain \$18.00

Rich aromas of vanilla, oak, fudge and caramel create an inviting first impression. The palate is smooth and sweet with subtle spice, finishing long, gentle and warmly satisfying.

Egan's Conviction \$24.00

Floral grains, honey and dried apricot lead to a light, delicate palate of wafers, leather, sultanas and almond, with hints of ginger chocolate and zesty fruit. The finish is long and gentle, with ginger, lemon zest and a subtle touch of liquorice lingering on the palate.



Flaming Pig Black Cask (Dublin, Ireland) \$14.00

Hot chocolate and strong tea, with toasted brioche underneath. BBQ pineapple and mango develop on the palate. Chocolatey & Peaches in syrup, nutmeg and toffee.

Freckin Irish whiskey (Down, Northern Ireland) \$14.00

The taste has good spicy notes of clove and cinnamon along with honey, vanilla, oak, and lemon zest. Short, slightly tart and spicy.

Glendalough Double Barrel (Wicklow Mountains, Ireland) \$14.00

Rich with dark fruit, cherry, raisin, fig and Christmas pudding. Floral notes with lemongrass, citrus Sweet and smooth, with butterscotch, honey and peppercorn, dried fruit and brown sugar.

Glendalough Pot Still (Wicklow Mountains, Ireland) \$16.00

Raw malt aromas, with tannic oak, creamy vanilla & oak char, with a wave of cinnamon spice. Palate Crystallised ginger and candied citrus, banana custard and maple syrup and dried herbs.

Grace O'Malley (Dundalk, Ireland) \$14.00

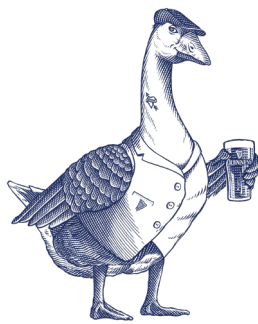
Oaky vanilla and sweet, nutty caramel meet rich malt, popcorn, and floral spiced orange. Dried fruits and honey flapjack, resinous oak with cinnamon, pepper spice and a gently warming finish.

Green Spot Single (Cork, Ireland) \$16.00

Matured in first and second fill ex-bourbon casks and ex-sherry casks. An extremely floral whiskey bursting with notes of green tea, peppermint, creamy vanilla, butterscotch, caramel, manuka honey.

Irishman Founders Reserve (Antrim, Northern Ireland,) \$14.00

Nose: Peach sweeties (they also made strawberries and cream sweets), apples and a soft, spicy hint of white pepper. Palate: Plenty rich with a glorious mouth feel. More ripe fruits, paired with vanilla and cinnamon.



Irishman Single (Carlow, Ireland) \$18.00

Fruity flavours on the nose. A hint of liquorice & vanilla fudge. A classic pudding of peaches and cream with crushed up biscuits and almonds hit the palate, with oak cropping up near the end.

Jameson (Cork, Ireland) \$14.00

Spicy, nutty and vanilla notes with hints of sweet sherry and exceptional smoothness on the palate.

Jameson Black Barrel (Cork, Ireland) \$16.00

Intensified aromas of butterscotch, fudge and creamy toffee. Nutty notes are in abundance alongside the smooth sweetness of spice and vanilla. Enjoy the richness and intensity of toasted wood and vanilla.

Jameson Caskmate (Cork, Ireland) \$16.00

Crisp orchard fruits like green apples and pears, mild pot-still spices. Long and sweet with milk chocolate and butterscotch.

Jameson IPA (Midleton, Ireland) \$16.00

Floral, herbal hops, grapefruit citrus notes with subtle orchard fruits, complemented by wood shavings and a little nuttiness. Fresh fruit and hops give way to grains of barley and signature smooth finish.

Jameson Orange (Midleton, Ireland) \$14.00

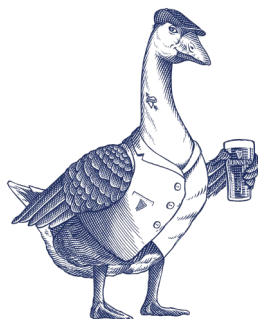
Delicate, smooth and full mouthfeel with distinctive notes of orange zest as well as spicy, nutty, sweet vanilla. Clean finishes with a sweet orange aftertaste.

J.J Corry the Gael (County Clare, Ireland) \$26.00

Apples, crunchy pears, guava and unripe mango on the nose. Stewed gooseberry and hints of spicy grain

J.J Corry the Hanson (County Clare, Ireland) \$22.00

It begins with bright green apple and creamy coconut, followed by notes of fresh oak, rye grass, and lemongrass.



J.J Corry the Battalion Tequila Cask (County Clare, Ireland) \$30.00

Honey, zesty orange, roast agave, toasted oak and walnuts fill the nose, complemented by notes of pineapple, pear, caramel, green grass, walnut, oak, pepper and dried herbs

Kilabeggan Blended Irish Whiskey (Westmeath, Ireland) \$14.00

Sweet caramel, vanilla and toasted wood aromas. Delicate malt and clean grain become more apparent with time, soft almond nougat, peach, caramel and vanilla flavours before finishing quickly with soft, light malt sugar flavours.

Kinahans Kasc (Ireland) \$16.00

Nose of plum, pear and apple crumble. Sweeter aromas of caramel and pineapple, with charred oak, and caramelised tropical fruit with a scattering of vanilla pod.

Kirker & Greer Shamrock 10yr (Belfast) \$18.00

A bold and flavorsome whiskey with notes of tropical fruit, bananas, cinnamon, cream, vanilla, caramel, pepper, toasted oak and toffee.

Knappogue Castle (County Cork, Ireland) \$28.00

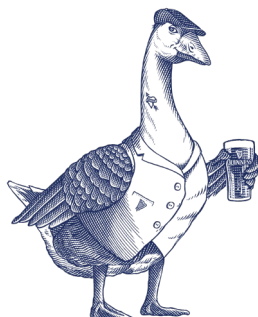
Fruity, nutty, and vanilla notes. Finish: Medium-long going from fruity notes to a dry, but pleasant barley finish. Knappogue Castle 16-year-old is aged for a minimum of 14 years in bourbon barrels, then finished in Oloroso sherry casks to complete a minimum of 16 years

Lambay Small Batch (Lambay, Ireland) \$16.00

Slightly dry, fruity and very pure with notes of vanilla and fresh sawn oak. The sweet, stewed orchard fruits build in the glass. Some ripe citrus, an oily pot still character is followed by hints of green apple and spice enlivening the finish.

Liberties (Dublin, Ireland) \$14.00

Toasted malt, caramel, cherry, honey and wood spice. baking spice, sultanas, vanilla and pepper. Finished with a little milk chocolate and burnt malt loaf.



Method and Madness Signle Grain (Northern Ireland) \$16.00

a light-bodied, silky smooth taste featuring notes of vanilla, honey, creamy toffee, and sweet cereal alongside delicate hints of white pepper, clove, and zesty wood spices.

Method and Madness Single Pot Still (Northern Ireland) \$20.00

Nose of fresh pencil shavings, light rose petal and fresh rain on pine. Palate Warm toasted oak, fresh peeled grapefruit and zesty wood spices. Finish Sweet cereal, clove spiciness and fresh mint.

Paddy Irish (County Cork, Ireland) \$14.00

Mild and crisp, with hints of honey. Malty, fresh and woody nose with hints of vanilla.

Peaky Blinders (Cork, Ireland) \$14.00

Nose Blackcurrant and apple, with a hint of vanilla toffee underneath. Palate Melted chocolate, apricots, toasted oak and dried peels. Finish A subtle hint of cinnamon sticks around on the finish.

Powers Gold Label (County Cork, Ireland) \$14.00

Cinnamon, clove oil and white pepper in balance with apples and ripe pears, and a background of charred oak. All laid upon a crisp barley core, a wonderfully complex honey flavour.

Powers John Lane Release (Dublin, Ireland) \$18.00

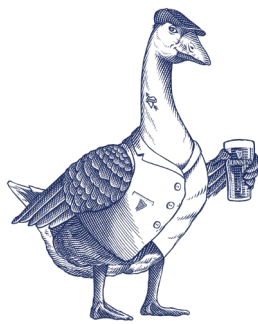
Full bodied spice front followed by vanilla, honey and dried apricot. Finish: lingering honey sweetness on toasted oak.

Powers 3 Swallow (Dublin, Ireland) \$16.00

Floral notes and hints of nutty almond and white chocolate. Spiced flavours of roasted nuts and a hint of cocoa chocolate. The addition of mineral water opens the whiskey to even more floral and fruity aromas.



Redbreast Lustau (Midleton, Ireland) \$22.00

Full flavoured and complex; silky smooth with a harmonious balance of spicy, fruity, sherry and toasted notes. Satisfyingly long, the complex flavours linger on the palate.

Redbreast 12yr Single Pot (Midleton, Ireland) \$24.00

A complex spicy and fruity aroma with toasted wood notes. Full-flavored and complex. Silky smooth with balance of spicy, fruity, sherry and toasted notes. The complex flavors linger on the palate.

Redbreast 15 (Midleton, Ireland) \$26.00

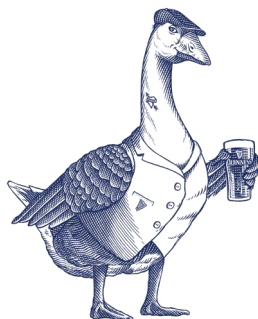

Creamy vanilla, hints of dried herbs and cinnamon. Finish Floral, herbal finish. Caramel on the tail. Overall A deliciously creamy, spicy and rich Irish blend.

The Whistler Blue Note 7yr (Boyne Valley, Ireland) \$20.00

The Blue Note is a sourced single malt aged for 5 years in first-fill bourbon barrels and then finishes its maturation for 2 years in oloroso sherry casks.

The Whistler Imperial Stout Cask (Boyne Valley, Ireland) \$18.00

Bright fresh lemons followed by cocoa nibs. Palate: Rich and oily mouthfeel with notes of lemon rind and florals at the start followed by a wave of coffee and subtle hints of smoke.

The Whistler Oloroso Sherry (Boyne Valley, Ireland) \$16.00

Deep amber hue reflects the influence of the sherry cask, while inviting aromas of dried fruits, warm spices, and a hint of nuttiness emerge.

Tullamore Dew (County Offaly, Ireland) \$14.00

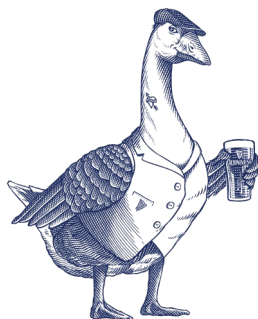

Waterford Lacken (County Wexford, Ireland) \$20.00

Complex and fruity. Orange, dark chocolate, grapefruit, apricot dried berries, straw, barley, fruit cookies, milky and floral notes. spicy and smooth. White pepper, cocoa powder, orange zest and caramel.

Writers Tears Cask (County Carlow, Ireland) \$28.00

Nose of cut grass and chocolate rise, butterscotch & nutmeg. Creamy cinnamon coconut, Chai tea and bitter butterscotch with barley notes on the end of the plate.

Writers Tears Marsala Cask (County Carlow, Ireland) \$20.00

Metallic notes, followed by a dusty woody note and plenty of (candied) nuts. Red grapes and honey sweetness. Hints of green apple. then fragrant sandalwood and juniper. Hints of baking spice, flashes of citrus in the end.

Yellow Spot 12yr Single Spot (Dublin, Ireland) \$24.00

Gorgeous aromatics with notes of wild honey, custard, creme caramel and almond flan. Entry is oily, buttery in turn as the spices develop in a double wave. Flavours of vanilla custard tart feature enlivened by soft spices.

The Flight of the Wild Geese marked the departure of an Irish army, commanded by Patrick Sarsfield, from Ireland to France. This departure was in accordance with the terms outlined in the Treaty of Limerick on 3rd October 1691, which concluded the Williamite War in Ireland. In broader historical context, the term "Wild Geese" refers to Irish soldiers who chose to serve in continental European armies during the 16th, 17th, and 18th centuries.

Today, the metaphorical usage of "Wild Geese" extends to Irish emigrants. This interpretation can be observed, for instance, in the Irish Times, where a recurring section titled "Wild Geese" features stories of Irish individuals living and working abroad, sharing their experiences.
