Alphabet Letters vs Consonant and Vowel Phonemes

ALPHABET LETTERS

Alphabet letters refer to the individual characters that make up a written language.

CONSONANT PHONEMES

J4

Consonant phonemes are produced with partial mouth closure and airflow obstruction by the lips, teeth and tongue.

Consonant phonemes can be voiced or unvoiced. VOWEL PHONEMES

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Vowel phonemes are the sounds produced by the vocal cords without any obstruction in the mouth or throat.

Vowel phonemes are always voiced.

Letters of the alphabet represent written characters, while phonemes represent sounds.
