Create a word web or morphological chart to visually represent relationships between words.

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Regularly revisit these concepts with new words to reinforce learning and build confidence in morphological analysis.

Connect the morphological discussion back to the original context.

Encourage students to think of other words that might be morphologically related or have similar derivational patterns.
