Hi, I'm Ronan. I felt a call to ministry, and a call to pursue more of Him. To grow in my faith and establish my walk with Him to see where He'd lead me.

My favourite thing about CHC was how involved in your life the lecturers were and the people who are on team. It felt like they were really invested in my journey.

I have memories of lecturers, they'd hear about a need a student had in class and then they stopped mid-class and lift that up in prayer. So I feel like they really cared and were not just invested in you kind of ticking a box and getting a degree, but in actually knowing God and serving His church and becoming a better Christian, a better disciple.

Jesus says He'll draw all men to Himself. So I think the cool thing for me was seeing how people from different walks of life, different experiences, even slightly different views, come together under the banner of Christ and come to know and pursue Him together.

I leveled up how I communicate in the Communications for Ministry class. Not even just on a stage or a platform, but with other people, sharing the gospel and talking about God.

One of the things that impacted me super profoundly was when we went on a retreat with the ministry college and we got guest ministers, guest speakers in to share with us, but also pray for us. Massive prophetic words spoken over my life that were super accurate things about ministry and preaching, about following God and things that I still can kind of lean back on and recognise now in hindsight how God was leading me, how He's shaping me.

I think because it wasn't just you getting head knowledge, but it's a balance of your heart for God growing you. You're being shaped. You're being formed.

CHC taught me to think at a deeper level and be able to have answers and solutions for people that maybe struggle to engage with God for various reasons.

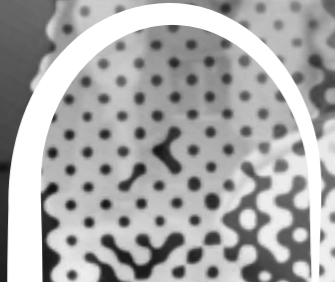



Scholarships

Regional Equity Scholarship

The Regional Equity Scholarship is open to Australian citizens and permanent residents located in a SEIFA (The Australian Bureau of Statistics Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas) Category 1 area.

The Regional Equity scholarship is valued at \$1,500 per course.

The First Generation Students scholarship is available for a student who is the first individual within their family to engage in tertiary level studies. This scholarship is for students enrolling in any degree at CHC and open to Australian citizens and permanent residents.

Valued up to \$1,000 per annum.

First Generation Students

Financial Hardship Allowance

The Financial Hardship Allowance is available in Semesters 1 and 2 for students who have experienced educational disadvantage as a result of financial hardship.

This allowance is valued at \$1,500 per year for a maximum of 3 years for Bachelor level courses.

International students can access a reduction in course fees of up to 20%.

Open to International students.

Applicants may enrol in any degree and may be asked to provide a statement of why they want to study at CHC.

International Students' Equity Bursary

First Nations Students' scholarship

The First Nations Students' scholarship is available for a student who identify as First Nations.

Valued up to \$8,000 per year for the length of the course (up to four years for undergraduate courses and up to two years for postgraduate courses).

Please note, First Nation students are also eligible for an ATAR adjustment of up to 5 ranks.

This scholarship is open to Australian citizens and permanent residents who aspire to be an influential Christian educator.

This scholarship is valued at \$8,000 per course.

Future Christian Teachers

Lifelong Learning Bursary

CHC values lifelong learning and is providing bursary to selected alumni who have been accepted to commence an eligible CHC course. The bursary is available to domestic students and international students alike.

The bursary is valued at a 10% reduction in the applicable tuition fees for the duration of enrolment in the course (domestic students) or for the standard full-time duration of the course (international students).

Admission Pathways

Our admission pathways are designed to provide options for course entry that will help you meet requirements and build a bridge to your future.

High School – *Early Offer Pathways*

We have a pathway designed to provide Year 12 students with an early offer to their preferred course without the need for an ATAR and/or Year 12 results. At CHC we recognise that an ATAR isn't the only indication of someone's ability to succeed at studying and pursuing a career.

School Principal's Reference Early Offer Pathway

With a letter from your Principal you can receive a conditional offer for your future course without your ATAR. This means you can secure your place at CHC without waiting for, or worrying about, your results!*

Headstart Early Offer Pathway

Students who successfully complete a unit in the CHC LAUNCH program while in Years 11 or 12 meet the academic requirements for entry to the related CHC course. This means you can guarantee your place at CHC without needing an ATAR or waiting for your final Year 12 results.*

Home School Early Offer Pathway

Through the Home School Pathway, students' home school results will be assessed on a case-by-case basis so that all education programs are recognised and individual circumstances taken into account. You don't have to worry even if your program doesn't provide you with an ATAR. We can assess your results individually!*

I've studied before

If you have studied Higher Education previously, even if you didn't finish, your studies might help you gain entry to CHC and receive recognition of prior learning.

If you have studied VET qualifications previously, we will need to assess the level of certificate you studied, but some VET and TAFE qualifications can help you gain entry and receive credits towards your CHC course.

I'm not a school leaver and don't have an ATAR

QTAC can assess your work history to determine your eligibility to apply for courses. In some cases this can help someone who did not finish high school to enter higher education.

Consider a bridging course

We have courses designed as bridging courses that fulfil the requirements for prerequisites for some of our degrees.

For example, if you have not met the mathematics requirements for a Bachelor of Education, each year we have a mathematics bridging course. Alternatively you may wish to enrol in the Undergraduate Certificate in Educational Studies. This course has no minimum ATAR and can be credited to the first 6 months of the Bachelor of Education. Students who successfully finish this course can gain direct entry into the mid-year intake for the bachelor.

Similarly, studying a diploma can be a great first step on your journey to further study. Successful completion of a diploma guarantees entry into the related bachelor course. This is a good option for business, behavioural sciences, and ministry courses.

Rank Adjustment Schemes

Our Rank Adjustment Schemes allow high school students, in particular circumstances, to have their ATAR Rank adjusted.

The **Educational Access Scheme (EAS)** allows an adjustment to be applied to the selection rank of applicants who have experienced difficult circumstances that have adversely impacted their studies. To be considered, applicants apply to QTAC for a confidential assessment of their circumstances.

The **CHC Partnership School Scheme** is for applicants completing Year 12 at a CHC Partner School. These students can benefit from a rank adjustment by 2.00. Ask your school or contact CHC to determine if your school is a CHC Partner School.

The **CHC Community Engagement Scheme** allows an adjustment of 2.00 selection ranks for applicants in CHC's catchment area, according to their residential postcode (4152 and 4122).

Frequently Asked Questions

Stepping into study is a significant decision and there are many details, questions, and options. Here are some of the questions we get asked every day.

What if I don't get the ATAR I hoped for?

Unlike larger providers in which quotas might restrict the number of applicants that can be admitted, CHC does not apply strict minimum ATARs to its undergraduate courses.

Instead, CHC takes a more holistic approach to admission which means that, if you do not get the recommended minimum ATAR for the course of your choice, you might still be offered a place in the course if you can demonstrate through other means that you are likely to succeed in the course.

For the recommended minimum ATARs for CHC undergraduate courses, see the course entries on the relevant pages of this Guide. The recommended minimum ATAR for a course can vary from year to year.

We also have pathways for entry to each of our undergraduate courses. No need to be disheartened – simply contact the Admissions staff at admissions@chc.edu.au

What if I don't have an ATAR score?

If you don't have an ATAR you may meet entry requirements by having at least Completed Year 12 or VET Certificate III (with a GPA of at least 4.0 for a graded Certificate) or by having successfully completed higher education study of at least one semester (full-time equivalent). Applicants with work and life experience who demonstrate readiness for higher education, including successful completion of the Special Tertiary Admission Test (STAT) as administered by QTAC, are also eligible for admission to undergraduate courses at CHC.

Can I try before I buy?

After you enrol in a course and commence a semester, there is a period of time during which you can engage in your studies (either on-campus or online), have access to learning materials and get feedback from lecturers before you decide if you want to continue in your course.

Each semester/study period has an advertised census date before which you can change your enrolment without financial or academic penalty. For more information, contact study@chc.edu.au

Are there any prerequisites?

Some courses have additional admission criteria, such as:

- completion of a relevant undergraduate degree (postgraduate courses only)
- subject prerequisites (undergraduate courses only)
- personal suitability (undergraduate and postgraduate courses)
- professional experience (postgraduate courses only)

The minimum standards you must meet for these criteria differ between courses. Where they are required, details are provided in the course entries on the relevant pages of this Guide.

For more detailed information, see the relevant course pages on the CHC website.

Some undergraduate courses have subject prerequisites (or accepted alternatives) that you must have completed to be eligible for admission. These requirements apply to courses in Education, for which you are expected to have a basic level of knowledge that is provided by completion of the subject prerequisites.

What do you mean by personal suitability?

Some courses have personal suitability requirements that you must meet to be eligible for admission. This applies to particular courses in Counselling and Ministry where, as a professional, you need to demonstrate certain attributes and qualities that uphold the ethical requirements of those professions.

In each case, you will be asked to demonstrate your meeting of personal suitability requirements through means such as interviews, personal statements and/or references.

Eligibility for a blue card, or similar working with children check will apply for all Initial teacher training courses.

Will you recognise my work experience or previous study?

We want to celebrate and acknowledge your work experience and prior learning, and are happy to review your CV or transcripts once you apply. For more information, email study@chc.edu.au

Does my professional experience count?

If you have not studied before, you can talk to our admissions team about how your work life might count towards your entry.

Some postgraduate courses require that you have previous or current professional experience to be eligible for admission.

These requirements assist in establishing that you have a relevant context upon which you can reflect and apply your learnings. The requirements as stated in the course entries are full-time equivalent (FTE).

What are my payment options?

Eligible students are able to defer some or all of their tuition fees through the Commonwealth government's Higher Education Loans Program (FEE-HELP) or Higher Education Contribution Scheme (HECS-HELP). These are loans that are repaid through the tax system once you begin earning above the repayment threshold. Students who are not eligible for HELP must pay their fees upfront.

Is there a minimum age for enrolment?

To be eligible for admission to an undergraduate course, you must be aged at least 17 years if you are a domestic student, and at least 18 years if you are an international student.

How many days do I have to come to class?

If you are enrolled in on-campus units, you will normally have three hours of classes per week for each of those units. If you are a full-time student who is doing four units, this means 12 hours of classes per week. These hours are generally scheduled across 3-4 days, but this can change from semester to semester.

Some on campus units are held as intensives, where the class contact time is concentrated into a number of whole days that are held in 1-2 sessions and may include weekends.

If you are enrolled in unscheduled online units, the learning is self-paced and supported by virtual classes that you may have to attend.

All of the scheduling arrangements that apply to classes are published before the semester commences, so you can know in advance what your study commitments will be.

How will you measure my language skills?

All courses at CHC have English language proficiency requirements that apply regardless of your country of birth, even if you are an Australian citizen or resident.

Except where noted, if you are admitted to an undergraduate course at CHC, it is assumed that you have knowledge that is equivalent to having achieved a passing exit grade in Year 12 English.

For students completing Year 12 in 2025, this is equivalent to having completed Units 3 and 4, with an exit grade of C, in one of the following QCAA subjects: English Literature, English and Literature Extension; English as an Additional Language.

For International students to meet the English language proficiency requirements for courses other than the undergraduate Education courses and the Master of Teaching courses, you must demonstrate that:

- for undergraduate courses, your secondary schooling, or higher education studies of at least one year (full-time equivalent), was conducted in the English language, or
- for postgraduate courses, your undergraduate degree was conducted in the English language, or
- you have achieved at least the minimum standard of results in an acceptable English Language Proficiency examination (see table below), the results for which are no more than two years old as at the commencement of your course.

For the undergraduate courses in Education and the Master of Teaching courses, you must demonstrate that:

- your first language is English, or
- you have satisfactorily completed senior secondary or accredited higher education studies of at least two years (full-time equivalent) in Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, the Republic of Ireland, the United States of America or Canada (excluding Quebec), or
- you have achieved at least the minimum standard of results in an acceptable English Language Proficiency examination (see table below), the results for which are no more than two years old as at the commencement of your course.

The ISLPR test will only be accepted if it has been administered by ISLPR Language Services, Mt Gravatt, Queensland.

What does AVAILABLE ONLY AT CHC mean?

Available only at CHC refers to courses exclusively registered to CHC through Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) for Australian Institutes of Higher Education. These courses cannot be studied through any other registered tertiary provider in Australia.
