## SLT team viewed data and discussed patterns. Data Analysis Team discussed key noticings in Acadience data. Members shared noticing that grade 2 and 5 have the fewest number of students entering into the grade below and well below. Ms. Ashley shared that parent engagement pieces will now be aligned with CEP goals. Acadience workshop was the first workshop to provide parents with the understanding of how students are assessed. Ms. Jennings shared the priority focus and team discussed **Priority Focus** important words that are central to our priority focus: Focus Priority In all content areas, teachers allows students to productively struggle and make their thinking visible on standards aligned tasks. Teachers use student discussion demonstration of reasoning, and other data as artifacts to determine next steps in their What words teaching and planning in order to increase stand out? students achievement. Members of the team shared that productive struggle, standard aligned tasks, reasoning, artifacts, and student achievement were keywords that were central to our school focus. Ms. Jennings shared that unpacking the grade level standards will be key to building on student growth. Team read and shared out how standards 3R3, 4R3, and 5R3 build on each other. The students are expected to describe and then in later grades explain and compare and contrast ideas in literary and informational texts. Goal is to increase ELA score from 41.5% to 47.5%. As a school we will drive growth by having teachers unpack standards, aligning End of Module Tasks and assessments to mirror NYS ELA exams. Teachers will be utilizing Linkit platform to analyze and streamline

data.
