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The 2025 fantasy football offseason is underway, and dynasty leagues are never far behind. The rookie draft season typically begins first, offering valuable insights into the future of teams. We've prepared a superflex dynasty rookie mock draft using our free simulator to help you prepare for the upcoming year.A standout pick in this mock draft is Travis Hunter at 1.06. As a two-way star, he's expected to make an immediate impact on the Jaguars' offense. With Brian Thomas Jr. and Trevor Lawrence already on the roster, Hunter has a real chance to earn volume and showcase his explosive upside in both reality and fantasy.Next up is Luther Burden III at 2.06, a highly touted recruit who showed off his electric playmaking skills during his sophomore season at Missouri. Despite some inconsistencies in his junior season, Burden's potential ceiling is incredibly high, making him a promising dynasty option.Finally, Jarquez Hunter rounds out our top three picks at 3.06. A talented but potentially buried running back behind two veterans, Jarquez possesses the skill and pathway to surpass them in the pecking order. With impressive yards after contact and breakaway percentage numbers, he's an exciting prospect for dynasty owners.Looking at the Fantasy Points Data, Hunter is considered one of the best values in the draft season. Derek BrownJordan James, a 5-10, 210-pound RB for the 49ers, was picked in the fifth round of the NFL Draft and is likely to start the season No. 3 on the depth chart behind Christian McCaffrey and Isaiah. Despite ordinary speed, James is a decisive runner who sees holes and charges through contact. He has a good nose for the end zone, with 26 TD runs over two seasons.Tai Felton, WR for the Vikings, is a ball-tracker with good hands and route-running ability. While he's thin at 6-2, 181 pounds, he's a tackle-breaker and not afraid of contact. The Vikings picked him in the third round, which suggests high expectations, but sharing targets with Justin Jefferson and Jordan Addison may limit his rookie impact.The top fantasy prospects for this years Dynasty Rookie Mock Draft season have been identified by four top experts. Their picks are expected to be relevant come the NFL Combine, NFL Draft, and your rookie fantasy drafts.Tetairoa McMillan: The Top Rookie WR Pick in Dynasty LeaguesI'm looking for a player who's already being compared to a fantasy football legend like A.J. Green on my dynasty roster. Tetairoa McMillan is the guy I chose at 1.02, thanks to his impressive college production and potential as a top-tier NFL wide receiver. He's consistently dominated on the field, showcasing stats that last season included 90 receptions, 1,402 yards, and 10 touchdowns. This year as a junior, he's solidified his pre-draft status with 37 receptions, 664 yards, and 4 touchdowns in five games.McMillan's combination of size, speed, and body control will make him a formidable threat in any NFL offense. He excels at making plays after the catch and consuming targets inside a large radius, similar to Mike Evans. That sets him apart from other prospects. I consider McMillan my rookie 1.01 in 1QB leagues.In contrast, Luther Burden is off to a slower-than-expected start to his junior season, but he's still making an impression on NFL scouts. He has the size and skill to be a bonafide WR1 for both teams and dynasty squads. His after-the-catch prowess is almost unmatched in this class.If you ask most college football fans, picks 1 to 3 in this early rookie mock draft likely went as expected. However, pick 4 is where things get interesting. Travis Hunter is a two-way superstar who's already making big plays on both offense and defense. On offense, he has 46 receptions, 561 yards, and 6 touchdowns through four games.The only question with Hunter is whether he'll commit full-time to wide receiver or try a hybrid approach in the NFL. I think he'll choose WR, but either way, he's all but a lock to be a first-round NFL draft pick come April. He might even force his way into the top 10.The 2025 running back class will change the landscape of the RB position in dynasty fantasy football. Quinshon Judkins is my RB2 of this esteemed class. He's a throwback, ground-and-pound type back with three-down potential. While he may not catch as many passes by design, Judkins still has the ability to make an impact.Isaiah Bond is a phenomenal pass catcher with explosive speed. He averages 18.2 yards per catch and has reached speeds of 22.1 mph on the field. His rookie draft position depends heavily on who drafts him.Nicholas Singleton is a talented runner with excellent speed, burst, and pass-catching abilities out of the backfield. He's a physical player with great vision, making him a strong contender for RB2 in the class.Omarion Hampton is an underrated running back from UNC. He put up impressive numbers last season (1,500+ yards rushing, 200+ receiving, and 15 touchdowns) and is on track to break out this year. He's averaging 5.6 yards per carry and has great size, making him a strong north-south runner with some build-up speed.Ollie Gordon II isn't as highly touted, but he still showed promise in the past. Despite struggling this season (3.8 yards per carry), he's got injury concerns and could still bounce back.That lingering frustration stems from Oklahoma States underwhelming performance on offense, particularly their front five. Their play calling has also been stale, which may be attributed to experience or other factors. Despite this, I choose to rely on what I see in the 2023 tape a game-changing, starting NFL-caliber running back, Ollie Gordon II. He is my top pick at 1.09.Getting TreVeyon Henderson, who would have been the top back in the 2024 class, at the 10th pick feels like great value in this 2025 rookie mock. What can be said about him that hasn't already? He has consistently dominated on both ground and air, showcasing his speed, power, and excellent pass-catching ability.With this pick, I went with Tre Smith, a wide receiver from Ole Miss who is off to a fantastic start. His size, speed, and dominance in the SEC make him an exciting prospect with upside similar to Nico Collins.For my final selection, I chose Colston Loveland, the talented tight end from the University of Michigan. As the TE1 off the board, he will likely be a high pick in both NFL and rookie drafts. While not a generational prospect like Kyle Pitts or Brock Bowers, Loveland makes big-time catches and has been Michigan's top receiving weapon so far this season.The 2025 NFL Draft is approaching, and fantasy football dynasty leagues are shifting their focus. Our staff at RotoBaller has begun a series of dynasty mock drafts to help you prepare for the upcoming season. In our first staff dynasty mock draft, we've focused on a rookie-only draft for a 12-team league with non-Superflex format and standard PPR scoring.The quarterback class is considered "suspect" this year, but Cam Ward was still taken at pick 1.04. Given the non-Superflex format, Ward's high ADP of 1.05 is questionable. Meanwhile, Tyler Warren is widely regarded as the top overall tight end prospect, offering a strong combination of blocking and receiving skills.Ashton Jeanty is also considered the first overall pick in many rookie drafts, but Colston Loveland presents an intriguing alternative. With his better route-running skills and comfort in the slot, Loveland could outperform Warren if he sees more opportunities as a receiver.The conventional wisdom is that Omarion Hampton, Tet McMillan, and Luther Burden III will be the next three picks in some order. However, what happens after that? In PPR formats, TreVeyon Henderson might be an underrated gem due to his exceptional receiving skills and explosiveness, making him a strong contender as the second-most valuable rookie RB in such leagues. His versatility could lead to being chosen over Hampton, potentially placing the Buckeye at the top of the second round.In terms of the second round of dynasty rookie mocks, Matthew Golden's stock is rising, with some analysts projecting him for a first-round pick in the NFL Draft, which would significantly impact his draft value come May. After Golden, Skattebo and Dylan Sampson are names worth noting due to their potential as big-play backs who could settle into the mid-second round of most non-Superflex rookie drafts.On the other hand, quarterbacks Shedeur Sanders and Jalen Milroe are considered reaches in this format. Sanders lacks elite arm strength and mobility, making it hard for him to rise to the QB1 tier due to limited rushing yards or big plays. Taking him at 2.01 is seen as rich. Milroe, despite his physical attributes, has erratic accuracy and ball placement, making drafting him near his ceiling without considering his floor at pick 2.03 a risk.Finally, Devin Neal, who showed premium receiving skills and was arguably the best back at the Senior Bowl, might be slightly overvalued being picked at 2.04 in most rookie drafts unless an NFL team elevates his profile/stock with a high pick.In terms of sniping opportunities in round three, Jack Bech is significantly undervalued and underrated in both dynasty and NFL Draft communities, often going undrafted in analyst rookie mocks.happen, grabbing him at 3.05. This pick has potential to turn into a quality WR1 if he develops his size and hands. It's worth noting that Michael Thomas wasn't a first-round pick initially, either. Best Value Picks (Not Named Bech): Joey got a great value at 3.01 with RJ Harvey, who's a strong runner with surprising passing skills. He could quickly become a quality fantasy asset. I'm proud of my selection at 3.08, Elijah Arroyo, a tremendous athlete and receiver with George Kittle-level upside. Getting him late in the third is a steal. Matt Donnelly deserves credit for selecting Jalen Royals at 3.09, who's not an elite athlete but has experience and knows how to get open. He has a solid floor and ceiling, making him a bargain pick. Better Backs Left on Board: While Bhayshul Tuten and Woody Marks are viable prospects, several better running back prospects were still available when they were picked. LeQuint Allen, Trevor Etienne, Jordan James, and Brashard Smith are all more talented and likely to be drafted ahead of them in the NFL. They'll get a real chance to start before Tuten and Marks. Round 4 - Dynasty Rookie Mock Draft Players Who Will Go Earlier: Several players picked in the fourth round won't even sniff this round in May's real rookie drafts. Expect LeQuint Allen, Mason Taylor, and Brashard Smith to all go higher than they did here. One Deep Sleeper and One Big Bust: Jaydon Blue is an intriguing late-round sleeper with size, length, and receiving chops. He could offer greater value than his cost. On the other hand, Donovan Edwards' film suggests he shouldn't be going higher due to ball security issues. Round 5 - Dynasty Rookie Mock Draft Late-Round Bargains: While this draft lacks elite fantasy weapons at the top, it's incredibly deep, especially at running back and tight end.The 2024 fantasy football season may be over, but the excitement is already building for the 2025 rookie draft cycle. In this mock draft, we'll take a closer look at some intriguing late-round options, particularly at receiver. One player who stands out in Round 5 is Pat Bryant from Illinois, who has solid size and acrobatic catching ability. A fifth-round pick would be excellent value for an athlete with these skills.Other notable players in this round include Cordarrelle Patterson Jr., Ricky White III, Kyle Williams, and Trevor Etienne. Each of these individuals boasts the skill set to see significant playing time early in their careers. While Bryant has potential to become a quality WR2 on a good offense, Etienne's receiving chops make him a strong candidate for a third-down back role.As the 2025 rookie draft approaches, teams will need to navigate the complexities of dynasty fantasy football. This mock draft aims to provide insight into the rising prospects and emerging talent in this year's class.

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
