The key to a Classic Martini is Chambord ===== martini glass A French martini is made with gin or vodka, and the key ingredient that makes it "French" is Chambord, a black raspberry liqueur that has been produced in France since 1685. The drink is typically served over ice. A comprehensive list of drinks, compiled by the International Bartenders Association (IBA), has undergone significant updates over the years. Initially, in 1993, there were 60 drinks categorized into three groups: Pre-Dinner, After Dinner, and Long Drink Style. The 2004 list expanded to 66 drinks, with five categories. Notably, the 2011 edition featured 77 drinks, divided into three sections: The Unforgettables, Contemporary Classics, and New Era Drinks. A substantial update in 2020 introduced 24 new drinks to The Unforgettables section, with notable additions such as Boulevardier and Martinez. Additionally, Corpse Reviver #2 and Zombie were added to the Contemporary Classics category. In the New Era Drinks section, Bee's Knees, Canchanchara, and Fernandito made their debut. The IBA has also removed 11 drinks from the list, including Bacardi, Derby, and Screwdriver, which now fall under different categories. Furthermore, Pisco Sour and Vesper have been relocated to Contemporary Classics, while Spritz Veneziano was rebranded as "Spritz" within the New Era Drinks category. The list of cocktails has been updated for 2024, with 15 new drinks added and 3 removed from the previous version. ----- 16 new drinks were introduced in the 2024 update: \* One drink was added to The Unforgettables category: Remember the Maine \* Three drinks were added to Contemporary Classics category: Cardinale, Garibaldi, Rabo De Galo \* Eleven drinks were added to The New Era category: Chartreuse Swizzle, Don's Special Daiquiri, Gin Basil Smash, Grand Margarita, IBA Tiki, Jungle Bird, Missionary's Downfall, Pisco Punch, Porn Star Martini, Sherry Cobbler, Three Dots and a Dash ----- On the other hand, three drinks were removed from the 2024 update: \* One drink was removed from Contemporary Classics category: Golden Dream \* Two drinks were removed from The New Era category: Barracuda, Yellow Bird ----- Other changes include: \* The Lemon Drop Martini was moved from "New Era Drinks" to "Contemporary Classics" \* The Southside was briefly removed in early 2021, but was present from mid-2021 to mid-2023. It was again removed from mid-2023, before being added in the 2024 update as "South Side" The International Bartenders Association (IBA) publishes an official list of cocktails, which is widely regarded as the standard reference guide for bartenders and cocktail enthusiasts. The list has been updated annually since its inception in 1961. ===== The IBA's official cocktails are defined by a set of rules that govern the preparation and ingredients of each drink.
