Pakistani Tiktoker Usama Bhalli also fell victim to a leaked video, with some claiming the woman in the videos was his wife, while others alleged she was his first wife. Aliza Sehar questioned the need for such a video, and Usama's partner, known as 'Silent Girl' on TikTok, confirmed its authenticity but stated it was over a year old.
