## New leaf makeup guide

The appearance of your character in Animal Crossing: New Leaf is determined by the responses you give to Rover's questions on the train ride to your new town. There are three options, and each answer corresponds to a specific face style, which can be changed later at Shampoole for 3,000 Bells. However, your eye color can only be changed at this salon as well. Here is a chart that shows how to determine the outcomes of Rover's questions: \*\*Question 1:\*\* So, [player], do you get to go to [town] very often? \*\*Question 2:\*\* So why are you going there anyway? \*\*Question 3:\*\* Oh, so you're probably going to move there, aren't you? Your answers correspond to the following options: - I've never been there. I'm moving. I'll get a place there. - I've never been there. I'm moving. I'm sure I'll be fine. - I've never been there. Can't say! You guessed it! - I've never been there. Can't say! How'd you know? - I don't remember. I'm moving. - Yes, probably. I don't remember. I'm moving. - No, that's not it at all. I don't remember. I don't know. - Yeah, I think I will. I don't remember. I don't know. I'm not kidding, I've never been to that place before. But I'm definitely moving there. I'll find a new house and everything will be fine. I just don't remember where it is or anything. You seem to know, though. So, you think I'll be okay? Probably, yeah, probably. You know, in City Folk, Rover asks the player questions on the bus. It's kind of weird. He asks about excitement and stuff. And then there are these two groups, boys and girls, who get all excited about finding a new place to live. They're like, "I'll find one!" and "SO excited!" In Wild World, Kapp'n does the same thing on his way to the player's town in the taxi. He asks questions like "Why are ye settin' sail fer?" It's pretty calm. When I start playing Animal Crossing, Rover walks up to me on the train and asks for my name and time, as well as some other stuff. Like, what I'm moving there for? And where my new place is. If I don't answer correctly, they change my face or something. The player's appearance is determined by answering three questions to Rover on the train at the start of the game. This chart provides guidance on how to answer these questions to achieve a desired face and eye color combination. Unlike other guides, it uses exact wording from the English language versions, eliminating guesswork. To change eye colors, refer to the New Leaf Eye Color Guide. The player's response to Rover's questions will result in one of several possible faces, which are determined by the game's algorithm. The chart provides a list of options for each question, including: \* What do you like to do? \* Do you go to (your town) very often? \* How would you describe your personality? To change eye colors, follow these steps: 1. Answer Rover's questions according to the chart. 2. Use the provided options to select a desired face and eye color combination. Note: The game's algorithm may produce different results based on individual player responses. The Animal Crossing: New Leaf Makeup Guide provides additional information on changing care and styling in the game, including tips on using the salon (Shampoole) and more. The update brings a new feature to modify the skin tone of players' characters in Animal Crossing: New Leaf. Previously limited to face changes only, the Mii Mask makeup item now allows for adjustments to extremities as well. The addition aims to provide more variety to character customization, although it may require players to adopt a Mii character style instead of their original Animal Crossing appearance. Players can access this feature by visiting the barbershop or purchasing the Mii Mask makeup item. A mirror or vanity can also be used in the player's home to customize their look. In addition to skin tone changes, players can experiment with different facial expressions and emotions using a face guide provided in the game. The Face Guide offers various options for modifying facial features, allowing players to create unique looks for their characters.
