A double elimination bracket with six teams is a more complex tournament structure than a single elimination bracket. The key concept is that losing teams are placed in a separate "losers" bracket where they face each other until only one team remains undefeated. Since each team can lose up to two times, the typical 6-team bracket has multiple rounds of games before determining a single champion. Understanding these standard double-elimination rules will ensure you use the provided bracket correctly after downloading and printing it out. A six-team double elimination tournament bracket is the most typical format. Tournament brackets usually follow single or double elimination formats, but double elimination allows for at least two games within the bracket itself. A double elimination tournament includes a loser's bracket and has a minimum of eleven total games in a 6 team tournament bracket. Tournament seeding takes multiple factors into account such as team performance, strength of schedule, and player ratings. These rankings are usually done by sports analysts or coaches using statistical algorithms. The higher-ranked teams get better seeds. Current league standings can also be used to determine seeding if the tournament is an extension of a season. The team with the highest standing gets the best seed, while others follow accordingly. Download 6 Team Double Elimination Tournament Bracket without Seeded Competitors (random placement) In our bracket, each team plays a matched team in either the first or second round based on the seeding arrangement. Losers from the top bracket go to the loser's bracket where they face off against other losing teams. The final match is between the winner of the loser's bracket and the undefeated team from the top bracket. A team can't exit without losing two games unless they win the tournament outright. If the loser's bracket winner beats the top bracket winner, a second game is played. The top bracket winner gets two losses before exiting like any other team. The loser's bracket winner must beat the top bracket winner twice to win the tournament. Formats for 6 Team Bracket: Single Elimination Single elimination is simpler. A team loses and exits after one loss. There are only five games in a six-team single elimination bracket. With two pool play games per team, there's a 3-game minimum with a total possibility of 11 games. Pool play guidelines are the same for both formats. Refer to pool play options above for more information. Download 6 Team Single Elimination Tournament Bracket with Seeded Competitors In single elimination without prior pool games or ranking rounds, there are only five games for six teams. As many as four teams can exit after one game. This format guarantees at least one game and a maximum of three games per team. Remember to communicate the schedule and bracket to all participating teams, officials, and spectators before the tournament begins.
