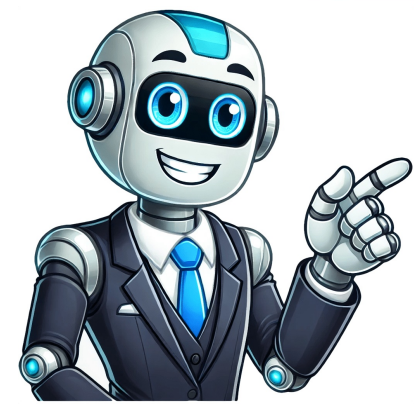


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The Joint Commission has released its 8th edition of accreditation standards for hospitals and academic medical centers, with a focus on advancing patient safety and quality improvement. ===== The new edition includes five main sections: Accreditation Participation Requirements, Patient-Centered Care, Healthcare Organization Management, Global Health Impact, and Academic Medical Center Standards. The Global Health Impact section has been enhanced to address environmental sustainability issues, such as governance, tracking and reporting, employee engagement and empowerment, procurement and supply chain use, and the use of environmental resources. ===== These new standards were developed in collaboration with the International Hospital Federation's Geneva Sustainability Centre, and their implementation will not be mandatory until January 1st, 2026. The International Hospital Federation is excited to see these sustainability standards as a major addition to the JCI 8th edition standards, given that the healthcare sector contributes approximately 6% of global carbon emissions and is increasingly affected by climate change. ===== In addition to the Global Health Impact section, the 8th edition includes new chapters on electronic health records, telehealth and cybersecurity, patient safety, sentinel event policy, organ and tissue transplant programs, and caring for vulnerable patients. We have streamlined our standards by approximately 10-15% to support the advancement of patient safety and enhance the overall care experience. As of January 1st, 2025, all hospitals and medical centers seeking accreditation or reaccreditation from JCI must follow the 8th edition standards, which will serve as the basis for their surveys. To help organizations comply with these new enhancements and changes, education sessions are available, providing valuable information on the latest edition of JCI standards. To ensure compliance, organizations must select well-defined, evidence-based measures applicable to their patient populations and services. With the retirement of Joint Commission International's Library of Measures, we recommend using The Joint Commission's performance measures for guidance on collecting data.

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
