GTA IV FATAL ERROR: RMN60 ===== Hello, I recently purchased and installed the Steam version of GTA IV: Complete Edition on my PC with Windows 10 64-bit OS. The game runs smoothly via LaunchGTA.exe at 45-55 fps but cannot be launched through the main GTAIV.exe executable file due to a fatal error: "GTA IV FATAL ERROR: DFA did not initialize properly." I've followed all compatibility steps, including downloading the latest version of video drivers-DirectX 9.11 (pre-installed 12)-latest version of Games for Windows Live marketplace client from xbox.com-Microsoft Visual C++ Redistributable (all editions), and removed graphic and memory restriction via shortcut launch parameter. I've also set compatibility to Windows Vista (SP2) for .exe files from the game directory, but reinstalled the game multiple times with no success. I have tried various solutions, including patching the game by placing a certain DLL file, which seems to disable GFWL, but this also disables multiplayer mode. I've also checked if there are any outdated setups of Games For Windows Live and LIVE ID software, as you suggested in another thread, but it's 7 years old now. I'm not sure what else to try, so please help me resolve this issue. Has anyone else experienced this problem? Is there a solution for launching GTA IV with LaunchGTAIV.exe? The Rockstar Launch Window error message, also known as Fatal Error WTV270, is a common issue that occurs when launching Grand Theft Auto IV (GTA IV). The good news is that most of these errors are easy to resolve with some simple troubleshooting steps. There are several reasons why the Fatal Error WTV270 error may occur. Some of the most common causes include: The wlogin_64 or wlogin_32 executable is not running. The game has not been updated for Windows Live GFWL shopper. The service related to the Live ID Sign-in Assistant is not running. The version of the game is one.0.8.0 or older. If you encounter this error message, try running some basic troubleshooting steps before trying any major solutions. First, upgrade the GFWL utility and check if the problem is resolved by following these steps: Uninstall Microsoft Games for Windows Marketplace and Microsoft Games for Windows - LIVE Redistributable from Programs and options. Restart your computer. Click here to initiate the transfer. Double-click on the downloaded file and follow the on-screen directions to install it. When the transfer is complete, restart your PC and launch the game to check if the error is removed or not. Alternatively, try installing XLive Update from the directory. To do this: Download the XLive tool from your favorite browser. Extract the files from the folder and paste xlive.dll at C:\Program Files (x86)\Steam\steamapps\common\Grand Theft Auto IV\Installer. Launch the game and check if the problem is resolved. If you're not having luck with these solutions, try installing and running the Windows Live Sign-in Assistant. If it's not already installed, download and install it from your favorite browser: Download Windows Live sign-in assistant from your favourite browser. Double-click the downloaded file and follow the on-screen directions to install it. Restart your PC when the installation is complete. Open This PC and right-click any empty space to open properties. Check and write down your system type below the System section. If it's 64-bit, run wlogin_64.exe and if it's 32-bit, run wlogin_32.exe. Go to the subsequent path and launch the installer wlogin_64 file. Another solution is to run the game in compatibility mode. This usually fixes the issue: Right-click on the GTA IV executable. Click on properties. Locate and click on the Compatibility tab. Check the box that says "Run this program in compatibility mode for" and select Windows Vista (or an earlier version). Download the Windows Live sign-in assistant from your favorite browser. Install it initially and restart your pc when the installation is complete. Open This PC and right-click anyplace on an empty space and click on properties. Check and inscribe your system sort below the System section. If it's 64-bit, run wlogin_64executable; if it's 32-bit, run wlogin_32executable. ===== Another solution is to run the game in compatibility mode. Right-click on the GTA IV executable. Click on properties. Locate and click on the Compatibility tab. Check the box settled by the facet of "Run this Program in Compatible mode for". Now choose a version of Windows that's older than yours. Click Apply and launch the sport. ===== Running the game in windowed mode may also resolve the issue. Right-click on the GTA IV executable. Click on properties. Locate and click on the Shortcut tab. In the target location, scroll to the top and add '-window'. Click apply and restart your pc. ===== Downgrading the game version may also fix the Fatal Error WTV270. Restart your pc to form positive that GTA IV is totally closed. Download the 1.0.7.0 patch from your favorite browser. Extract the downloaded folder within the game folder. Double-click the UpdateTitle.exe file and follow the on-screen directions for the installation purpose. Restart your pc. =====
