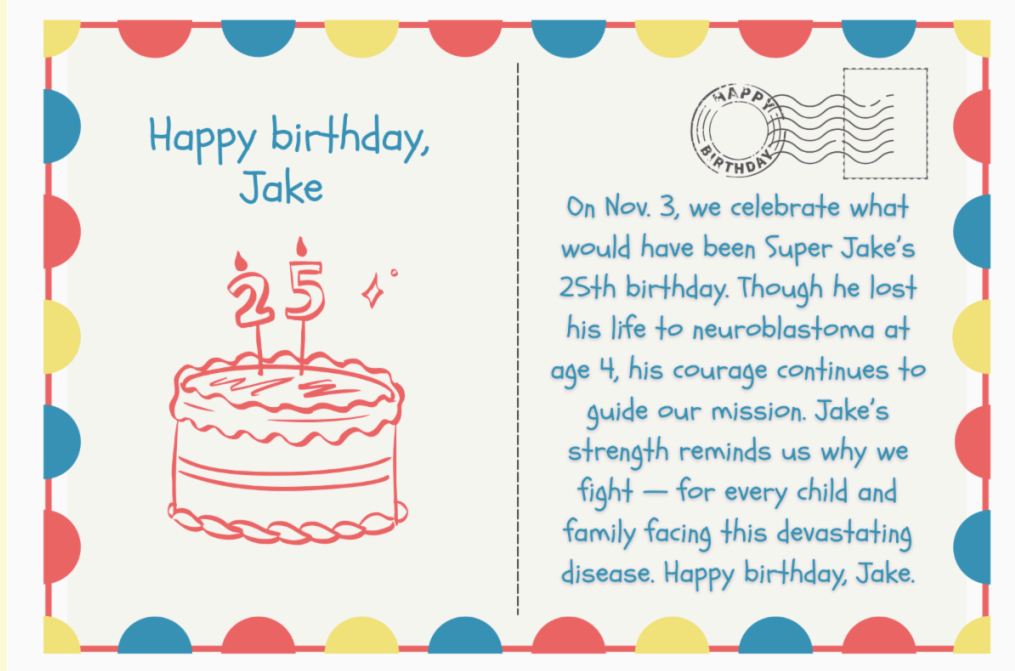

## Neuroblastoma at a Glance: Fast Facts!

According to the American Cancer Society, there are approximately 600 to 800 new cases of neuroblastoma each year in the United States. It is the most common cancer in infants under 1 year old.

- Thanks to research and support from families and foundations like Super Jake, survival rates have significantly improved over the past two decades — with low- and intermediate-risk patients now having a 5-year survival rate of over 90%.
- In the past 10 years, new immunotherapy treatments have brought hope to children with high-risk neuroblastoma — helping the body's immune system fight the cancer more effectively.
- Every year, thousands of children who have beaten neuroblastoma go on to live full lives — attending school, playing sports, and celebrating cancer-free milestones with their families.
- While childhood cancer research doesn't receive equal funding, The Super Jake Foundation has awarded more than \$4.5 million to support families' essential needs — from long hospital stays and treatments to navigating difficult healthcare journeys.
