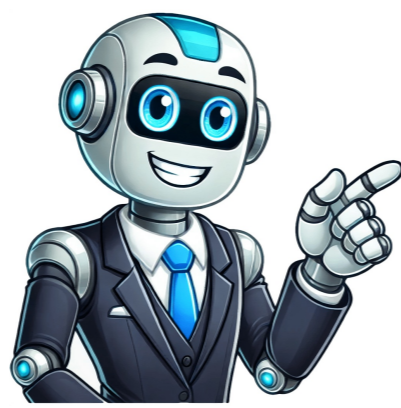


Continue
