David Colander is a distinguished professor at Middlebury College in Vermont. With an impressive publication record, he has authored, co-authored, or edited over 35 books and more than 100 articles covering various subjects. Some of his notable works include 'Principles of Economics' (McGraw-Hill), 'History of Economic Thought' (co-edited with Harry Landreth) (Houghton Mifflin), 'Why Aren't Economists as Important as Garbage?' (Sharpe), and 'MAP: A Market Anti-Inflation Plan' (co-authored with Abba Lerner) (Harcourt Brace Jovanovich). His books have been translated into multiple languages, including Bulgarian, Polish, Italian, Spanish, and Chinese. Holding a Ph.D. from Columbia University, he has taught at several prestigious institutions, including Columbia University, Vassar College, the University of Miami, Princeton University, and Middlebury College. In 2001-2002, he was honored as the Kelley Professor for Distinguished Teaching at Princeton University. His professional affiliations include being a consultant to Time-Life Films, Congress, and Brookings Policy Fellow, with roles in various economic societies such as Vice President and President of the Eastern Economic Association and Vice-President of the History of Economic Thought Society. His dedication to economic education and complex systems earned him a reputation as a thought leader in the profession. David Colander was a renowned American economist who left a lasting impact at Middlebury College. Wunnava described him as his guiding star and an exceptional mentor, whose career peak was having Colander as a colleague in the Economics Department. In 2013, Colander co-developed the Professors of the Practice program with President Ron Liebowitz to provide students with a more comprehensive education. He headed the program until his retirement in 2022. Colleagues like Amy Holbrook and Tim Nguyen praised Colander's support for staff members and students alike. Ramaswamy recalled Colander's efforts to bring prominent economists and Nobel laureates to Middlebury, while Serajuddin remembered how Colander treated him like family and offered financial assistance. Xu shared a heartfelt story about Colander's generosity and compassion as a teacher. Colander received his Ph.D. from Columbia University and has taught at various institutions, including Princeton University and Middlebury College. He was the Kelley Professor for Distinguished Teaching at Princeton in 2001-2002. Colander is a prominent economist who has served as president of the Eastern Economic Association and History of Economic Thought Society, and his work has been published in numerous journals. He has also held positions as a consultant to Time-Life Films and Congress, and was a Brookings Policy Fellow. A recipient of The John R. Commons Award from Omicron Delta Epsilon, he is listed in Who's Who?.
