Sydney due to have very own 'Opera House'

On January 29, Danish architect Jørn Utzon won the international design competition for the Sydney Opera House.

Avid readers may remember in 1956 the herald published an international design competition for an opera house design to be constructed on Bennelong Point.

The competition was open for 11 months and closed finally, December 1956. The panel, which included renowned architect Eero Saarinen, began judging in January this year and unanimously selected Utzon's design. Utzon received £5,000 for his winning submission.

Utzon's design (Entry No. 218) featured interlocking concrete shells and was famously inspired by the simple, structural act of slicing an orange
