WINTER is seeking a professional instructor with a passion for training/preparing the next generation of tradeswomen to work at its Commerce training facility. The person in this role plays a crucial role in implementing the Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3) aimed at preparing women for union careers in the building and construction trades. This individual will facilitate learning through a structured curriculum and hands-on activities, ensuring participants gain essential skills and certifications.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Adhere to safety regulations, ensuring a safe learning environment for all participants.
- Mentor and train participants, share knowledge and experiences to help develop the skills necessary to succeed as tradeswomen.

- Enforce all safety policies and procedures.
- As needed, assist with the planning of activities and special events for participants.
- As needed, represent WINTER at public events.
