















Use of Cash Survey Findings & Trends

- 98% of Canadians report no issues using cash at point of sale
- Coin user demographics are clearly understood
- Few unbanked in Canada, but those in financially precarious situations highly dependent on cash/coin





Use of Cash Survey Highlights

- 24% prioritize cash/coin use
- 66% said credit-card surcharges influence payment choice
- 74% have no plans to go cashless





Coin Counting Exercise

- Volume and value of coins accumulated per household is declining
- 30% use coins as short-term savings toward small purchases and as a small emergency cash reserve




