PROGRAMME AND FORMATS

We try to design a varied programme, with different formats, lengths, and breaks. This means you can choose what works best for you.

Digital accessibility and Knowledge Modules

We want our website and digital materials, like PDFs and slides, to be accessible to everyone. We aim to follow WCAG 2.2 level AA, the international standard for web accessibility. We test our website with users who use screen readers and other assistive technology. We keep working to improve things, like adding text descriptions to images and subtitles to videos.

This also applies to the Knowledge Modules that are part of the Scholarship Programme, which you will access through our website. Each module has different formats, with sources that are short or long, simple or advanced, as well as text, audio and video. Each module also has a list of extra sources, if you want to learn more. We try to only use accessible and open access formats and sources.

Events and workshops

We always try to offer variation in the program of our events. This means different lengths, types, and content, as well as different seating options in the room. You can stand, sit, lie down, or walk around during any event, if needed. Do what feels right for you.

- We always offer a quiet space.
- We always offer closed captioning and speech-to-text.
- We always offer an induction loop.

- You can always bring a helper if needed.
- All venues have wheelchair access.
- All speakers are briefed on universal design, and how to design and present their talks so everyone can follow. They also follow the Bevica Foundation's guidelines for slides etc.

Food

Language

The Bevica Scholarship Programme language is English. We know this is a foreign language to almost everyone in the room. We all do our best to express ourselves in a language that is not our own.

THE VENUES

The scholarship programme takes place at Musholm in Korsør. The final award show takes place at Industriens Hus in Copenhagen. If you travel by the cheapest public transport option, we can cover your travel costs.

Musholm Konference og Feriecenter

All workshops happen at Musholm Konference og Feriecenter, which is owned and run by The Danish Muscular Dystrophy Association. Musholm is the most accessible conference venue in Denmark and has won several international awards for accessibility. You can read more and see pictures of Musholm here:

You can travel to Musholm by train or by car.

- *By train:* Take the main IC train line to Korsør station. From there, it is a 10-minute walk or wheel to Musholm.
- *By car:* Drive to Musholmvej 100, 4220 Korsør. Musholm has very good, accessible parking facilities. Parking is free.

Industriens Hus

The award show will be held at Industriens Hus, which is owned and run by Danish Industri. Industriens Hus has barrier-free access and accessible restrooms. You can travel to Industriens Hus by train, car, bus or metro.

- *By train:* Nearest train-stations are Hovedbanegården and Vesterport station. From both stations, it is a 10-15 minute walk or wheel to Industriens Hus.
- *Car:* Drive to H.C. Andersens Boulevard 18, 1553 København V. Paid parking is available in the underground car park at Industriens Hus, including accessible parking spaces.
- *Metro:* Nearest metro station is Rådhuspladsen. From there, it is a 5 minute walk or wheel to Industriens Hus.
- *Bus:* Routes 5C and 2A, as well as a long line of other buses, stop near Industriens Hus on either Vesterbrogade or H.C. Andersens Boulevard. From there, it is a 5-10 minute walk or wheel to Industriens Hus.
