The Bevica Scholarship Programme

In celebration of the Bevica Foundation's 150th anniversary, the board of trustees has decided to implement the Bevica Scholarship Programme to honour and grant donations to students and lecturers who produce learnings of great importance within their fields in areas comprised by the Bevica Foundation's objects.

The Bevica Scholarship Programme is implemented to inspire and encourage students and lecturers across all disciplines to acquire and create new research-based knowledge about Universal design as a lever for the pledge to Leave No One Behind in a Danish context. This new innovative knowledge can shed light on the current challenges facing society to secure full and equal inclusion for everyone, regardless of ability, in all aspects of daily life.

Furthermore, the ambition of the programme is to stimulate an increase in teaching and curricula development within Universal design at Danish universities, design schools and university colleges.

The Bevica Scholarship Programme offers two main prizes for winning students (one bachelor student main prize and one master student main prize) and two individual main prizes for the two individually winning lecturers.

The applications received under the Bevica Scholarship Programme from eligible applicants will be sorted in two categories:

- **"Student Applications"** (applications received from eligible students)
- **"Lecturer Applications"** (applications received from eligible lecturers)

From all applications received, up to 40 applications in total will be selected and qualify for the final round (the **"Short List"**), of which up to 12 may be Lecturer Applications and up to 28 may be Student Applications. It is from the Short List that the winner of the bachelor student main prize and the winner of the master student main prize will be selected. Each of the two winning students will receive a cash donation from the Bevica Foundation of DKK 200,000. Two individual Lecturer Applications from the Short List will be selected as individual winners of main prizes for lecturers under the Bevica Scholarship Programme. The two winning lecturers will each receive DKK 130,000. A selection of Short List applicants will be invited to participate in the final-pitch round at the award show. All applicants who participate in the final-pitch round but do not win a main prize will receive a cash donation of DKK 30,000 as travel grants.

In addition, by submission of any application from an eligible applicant, you are automatically given access to the Bevica Scholarship Alumni Association, a unique opportunity to meet like-minded and share experiences and thoughts within your respective fields.

You are eligible to receive a travel grant or win the main prize under the Bevica Scholarship Programme if you are either a student or a lecturer in accordance with the qualifications set out in these terms below.

Terms for applications under the Bevica Scholarship Programme

Application as a student:

You are eligible for the grant if you are enrolled at a Danish research-based university, university college, or architecture- and design school in the spring semester 2027 and have completed at least three semesters of your education.

Application as a lecturer:

You are eligible for the grant if you have a documented affiliation with a Danish research-based university, university college, or architecture- and design school. Furthermore, lecturers must be able to document active teaching activities within the past two years at the beginning of ideation in February 2027. Lecturers from all disciplines can participate.

All applications (from students and/or lecturers):

Students and lecturers can apply for a grant under the Bevica Scholarship in accordance with the conditions set out above, however employees of the Bevica Foundation and such employees' relatives and spouses and life partners cannot apply for a scholarship.

If you apply for a grant, but your application does not qualify for the Short List, you may apply again.

In order to be eligible to submit an application, you must have participated in at least one of the Bevica Foundation's ideation workshops on 6th of February 2027 and 6th of March 2027.

Submission of an application gives access to participate in alumni activities.

Following your application for the Bevica Scholarship, we will contact you through the contact details stated in your application. Furthermore, all students and lecturers will be contacted after their participation in the Bevica Scholarship in relation to alumni activities.

When you provide the Bevica Foundation with your application for a grant under the Bevica Scholarship and accept the donation terms, you also accept the terms and conditions of the agreement regarding the Bevica Foundation's taking and use of photos and recordings stipulated in the appendix to these donation terms.

The submission of the Student Application/Lecturer Application does not restrict the Bevica Foundation from using the information that is contained in the Application, including but not limited to the ideas, projects and issues raised in the Student Application/ Lecturer Application in any possible way, including but not limited to further develop or use the ideas, projects and issues themselves or with assistance from a third party or by referring to such information in general e.g. in connection with implementation of future scholarships or on the Bevica Foundation website.

Terms for applications that qualify to the Short List

If your application is selected and qualifies for the Short List, you must in order to be considered for travel grants and the main prizes submit documentation for an agreement made with the knowledge environment you will visit. The investigation phase is planned in dialogue with the Bevica Foundation and should be completed as soon as possible after receiving the Bevica Scholarship award and no later than December 31st 2028 for students and December 31st 2029 for lecturers.

It is also a requirement that you:

- Participate in the Bevica Foundation's workshop on the 4th-5th of June 2027.
- Participate in the Bevica Foundation's award ceremony on 7th of October 2027.
- Are available for and will participate in arrangements and presentations (e.g. interviews, photo shoots etc.) during the final round.
- Are available for and will participate in recruiting activities for the Bevica Foundation in the fall of 2028.

In case of illness or other documented inability to fulfil any of the above requirements, the Foundation may request a medical certificate or equivalent documentation. The Foundation may also assess whether non-participation prevents submission of the final application.

For Lecturer Applications that qualify to the Short List, it is a requirement that you also document your affiliated institution's approval or recognition to use the prizes for the purposes they are given (i.a. that your affiliated institution grants leave of absence for travel).

If your application is selected and qualifies for the Short List, you cannot apply again.

Submission of an application gives access to participate in alumni activities.

Terms for the winners of the main prizes

In order to be qualified to win the main prizes as either a student or a lecturer, you must:

- Be available for and participate in arrangements and presentations pursuant to the individual plan prepared for the grant period.
- Be ambassador in the year following your homecoming, including conducting presentations.
- Participate in at least two recruiting events for the 2029-2030 Bevica Scholarship Programme.
- Participate in alumni activities and communicate learnings from the grant period.
- Submit written reporting and accounts at the end of the grant period.

Any deviations to the above and other agreements require written approval from Research Director, Camilla Ryhl.

The Bevica Scholarship is to be used for enrolling at a foreign university or equivalent higher education institution, taking up a position as a visiting researcher or similar role at a foreign university, research

institution or equivalent academic environment, or taking on an internship with a relevant international NGO or company, in accordance with the plan agreed between the recipient and the Foundation. For lecturers, the stay must be of a teaching or scientific character at a foreign university, university college, research institution, or equivalent academic environment - this includes stays as a visiting researcher or guest lecturer; stays consisting solely of conference attendance do not qualify. The stay does not need to constitute a full semester for either students or lecturers.

This includes tuition, travel fees, rent, and living expenses during the stay.

Terms for the winners of the travel grants

In order to be qualified to win travel grants as either a student or a lecturer, you must:

- Be available for and participate in arrangements and presentations pursuant to the individual plan prepared for the grant period.
- Be ambassador in the year following your homecoming, including conducting presentations.
- Participate in at least two recruiting events in the 2029-2030 Bevica Scholarship Programme.
- Participate in alumni activities and communicate learnings from the grant period.
- Submit written reporting and accounts during or at the end of the grant period, in accordance with the plan agreed between the recipient and the Foundation.

Any deviations to the above and other agreements require written approval from Research Director, Camilla Ryhl.

The travel grant is to be used to visit a foreign research-based university, university college, research institution, design school, or equivalent academic environment, to acquire new knowledge and experience and/or to stimulate and strengthen teaching and curricula development within Universal design in a Danish context, in accordance with the plan agreed between the recipient and the Foundation. For students, the stay may also take place as an internship with a relevant international NGO or company. For lecturers, the stay must be of a teaching or scientific character - this includes stays as a visiting researcher or guest lecturer at a foreign university, university college, research institution, or equivalent academic environment; stays consisting solely of conference attendance do not qualify. The stay does not need to constitute a full semester for either students or lecturers.

This includes travel fees, rent, and living expenses during the stay.

Terms regarding travel advisories, insurance and travel disruptions for all scholarship recipients under the Bevica Scholarship Programme

The Bevica Foundation does not support or encourage travel to war zones, active conflict areas, or other countries or regions to which the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Udenrigsministeriet) advises against travel, whether such advice is based on armed conflict, severe security risks, natural disasters, disease outbreaks, or other extraordinary circumstances.

From the Foundation's perspective, travel to such areas is neither required nor expected in order to fulfil the obligations under the Bevica Scholarship Programme, including in relation to learning outcomes, reporting, or dissemination. The Foundation is confident that sufficient academic input, learning, and relevance can be achieved through alternative approaches, such as desk research, remote interviews, collaboration with relevant organisations, or engagement with secondary data and expert sources.

Should a scholarship recipient nevertheless choose to travel to a country or area subject to a travel advisory from the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, such travel would be undertaken entirely at the individual's own initiative and responsibility. The Foundation does not assume any responsibility or liability in connection with such travel, including with respect to personal safety, health risks, insurance coverage, permits, or other risks associated with the stay.

It is at all times the recipient's sole responsibility to obtain sufficient and appropriate insurance, including travel and cancellation insurance. The Foundation accepts no responsibility in the event of missing or inadequate insurance, and any costs related to the taking out of necessary insurance cannot be covered by funds from the Foundation.

The same shall apply to any other costs associated with travel to areas subject to a travel advisory, including travel, establishment, tuition, living expenses, and other expenses related to the stay, which may not be covered, directly or indirectly, by funds from the Foundation, irrespective of the general scope of eligible expenses under the Bevica Scholarship Programme.

The recipient bears the full responsibility for obtaining any permits, approvals, or authorisations from public authorities that may be required or recommended in connection with entry into and stay in the relevant country or area. The Foundation does not assume any direct or indirect responsibility or liability in this regard.

The Bevica Foundation does not cover additional costs incurred as a direct result of flight cancellations, geopolitical events, natural disasters, or other unforeseen events affecting travel. Recipients are encouraged to contact their insurance company and/or airline for possible reimbursement.

If travel plans need to be changed as a result of a travel advisory, flight cancellations or other unforeseen circumstances, the recipient shall contact the Foundation in writing before making any changes to destination, timing, or project content. The Foundation will treat such requests with understanding and will strive, together with the recipient, to find a solution within the framework of the grant.

All scholarship recipients are encouraged to stay informed of the applicable travel advice issued by the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, including via its official website (www.um.dk), and to take such advice carefully into account when planning their activities.

APPENDIX - AGREEMENT REGARDING THE TAKING AND USE OF PHOTOS AND RECORDINGS

1 THE PARTIES AND CONCLUSION OF THE AGREEMENT

1.1 This agreement (the "**Agreement**") is entered into between the Bevica Foundation, CVR no. 75 57 63 15, (the "**Foundation**") and the applicant of a grant under the Bevica Scholarship (the "**Applicant**").

1.2 By accepting the donation terms for the Bevica Scholarship, the Applicant represents and warrants that the Applicant has also read, understood, and accepted the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement, and that the Applicant has full authority, power, and capacity to enter into this Agreement.

2 RECORDINGS

2.1 The Foundation intends to photograph, film and/or in other ways depict the Applicant, record sound recordings of the Applicant, or record a combination of pictures and sounds (the "**Recordings**") in connection with the Bevica Scholarship (as described throughout the donation terms), including during the mentioned workshops, and the Applicant hereby agrees to participate in the making of the Recordings on this basis.

2.2 The Recordings may be made by the Foundation or a third party on behalf of the Foundation.

3 USE OF RECORDINGS

3.1 The Applicant hereby grants the Foundation a transferable, non-terminable, irrevocable and royalty-free right and license to, amongst other things, use, store, reproduce, distribute, make available, display, publish and broadcast the Recordings for the promotion of the current Bevica Scholarship and any future Bevica Scholarship programmes on any media, including print, brochures, posters, the Foundation's website, social media, including Facebook, Twitter, Instagram as well as LinkedIn, and as a part of any other marketing material associated with the Foundation.

3.2 The Foundation may transfer its rights under this Agreement to third parties without the Applicant's consent.

3.3 The Foundation shall be entitled to edit the Recordings, provided that, in doing so, the Recordings do not infringe the Applicant.

4 DURATION AND TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT AS WELL AS PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

4.1 The Agreement becomes effective when the Applicant accepts the donation terms and hereby also this Agreement, and the Agreement is non-terminable for both parties.

4.2 The right and license is valid for a period of ten years from the end of the year where the Bevica Scholarship that is currently accepting applications is completed and closed.
