Mission Appeal Next Weekend: Next Sunday we welcome Fr John Boles, a Columban Missionary, to make an appeal on behalf of the Columban Missionaries. Rooted in their mission to foster justice, peace, and care for creation, the Columban Mission Appeal highlights the global efforts of the missionaries. By partnering with local parishes they hope to inspire and mobilise support for their work in countries all over the world. No doubt Fr John has had a fascinating and varied life as a priest and missionary. Nearly all of his experience as a missionary has been in Peru where he spent 27 years but he is back to his roots this weekend: he's a local man and Stockport County fan! The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children has launched a campaign to respond to the legislation passed in June when MPs voted first to allow women to abort their baby up to birth for any reason and then to legalise assisted suicide. They are seeking to build a critical Mass of people who oppose this legislation. As a first step they ask that we fill in one of the postcards available from the back of church and return it to them directly or to the parish office to be sent with others.
