Prayers for Peace and the Sanctity of Life: Thank you to those who were able to take part in our Holy Hours this summer for Peace and the Sanctity of Life. These issues remain of great concern – please continue to pray for them. At the Wednesday audience this week Pope Leo asked all the faithful to devote last Friday, the Feast of the Queenship of Mary, to prayer and fasting for peace saying, "I invite all the faithful to devote the day of 22 August to fasting and prayer, imploring the Lord to grant us peace and justice, and to dry the tears of those who suffer as a result of the ongoing armed conflicts. Mary, Queen of Peace, intercede so that peoples may find the path to peace." If you missed it Bishop John encourages us to dedicate a day this coming week to fast and pray for peace in our world.

Foodbank: Thank you for all your donations which are much needed and appreciated. Recently we were able to deliver 83kg of food thanks to a very generous donor who supplied about half of that. To give you an idea about the impact of all your gifts, the foodbank estimates 2kg of food to be the equivalent of one meal. The list of urgently required food is now rice pudding, tinned meat, tomatoes and soup, rice, bars of soap, toothpaste and cat food.
