**Readings this Week:** A few weeks ago (22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time) we had a Gospel about humility in social life – today we hear the Lord reiterating the message, but this time in reference to our prayer lives. The two Gospels are linked by the last words today, which also appear in the other story: "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." This phrase is obviously a key part of our Lord's teaching! The sin of "selfexaltation" consists in putting others in a lower place – as the Pharisee does to the tax collector. Perhaps the most telling phrase in today's Gospel is where Jesus refers to the Pharisee saying "this prayer to himself," rather than offering it to God! And since the Pharisee wasn't talking to God, how could be expect to be heard? (Source: Salford Liturgy).

Funeral this Week: On Friday we will celebrate the funeral of Winnie Carroll with a Requiem Mass at 12 noon. There will be a Mass at the usual time of 9.30am preceded by adoration and followed by the Rosary as usual.

Caritas Salford Campaign to End Child Poverty: A 2025 study by Loughborough University has found that more than 1 in 3 children across our diocese are going to school with empty tummies, which is over 333,000 young people. Furthermore, the most recent homelessness statistics at the end of March 2025 indicate that there are 8,855 children living in temporary accommodation in the local authority areas covered by our diocese.
