Readings this Week. A most unusual feast! The Lateran Basilica is the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome – an ancient church first built near the walls of the city of Rome by the Emperor Constantine at the beginning of the fourth century. Every Diocese in the world celebrates the feast of the Dedication of their own Cathedral, since the cathedral is the "mother and head" of all the churches in the Diocese (in Salford this is celebrated on 14th June). The Lateran Basilica, since it is the place where the Pope has his "cathedra" or Episcopal throne, has the title "Mother and Head of all the Churches of the City and the World". On this day we both celebrate and pray for the unity of those churches gathered in communion with the successor of Saint Peter. The marbles and mosaics of the Lateran, which together form a splendid and beautiful building, are a sign of the beauty of God's family, the Church, gathered in worship – the living stones of the temple of the Lord. This is a day to reflect on how this building, and cathedrals and churches everywhere are not just meeting places, but visible signs to the world of the Body of Christ in prayer. Red Wednesday 19th November 2025 – Awareness of the Persecution of Christians: The purpose of Red Wednesday is to shed light on the persecution and suffering for their beliefs of Christians around the world. Red Wednesday was started in 2016 by 'Aid to the Church in Need', a Catholic charity. We will mark the event this year at St Winifred's by praying a Novena after daily Mass leading up to Red Wednesday from Tuesday 11th November and then pray a Holy Hour at 7pm on 19th November. Wellspring: This is the last Sunday for our Wellspring Harvest Appeal. Thank you all for your generous donations! For the next 3 Sundays we will be collecting for the Rucksack Project, which aims to provide essential items for as many people facing homelessness as possible during the winter months. The items needed are rucksacks, roll mat, sleeping bag, flask, gloves, hat, torch, boxers, socks and wet wipes. Also, urgent items are men's joggers, jeans, coats, t-shirts (sizes M/L) and trainers (sizes 7 -11). Items need not be new but in good condition. The Church Toilet is now working again. It has been blocked 3 times now this year. It goes without saying please follow the directions on the notices and use it only for what it should be used for and nothing else! The centre is open during Masses also and toilets (and baby changing facilities) are also available there.
