Readings this Week: Advent opens with a great promise: "In the days to come..." the hope of a people who need God. "...The master is coming" is also a promise, not a threat to breed fear, but to answer our cry. So, Advent begins, not with thoughts of the past, with the coming of the Lord we celebrate at Christmas, but with the future, and the promise that He is coming back. We are encouraged to stay awake and treat every day as the day the Lord will come; we do not do this out of fear for a Master who beats his servants, but out of love of a Master who always treats us with mercy. Nevertheless, we must always be watchful, because we can grow sleepy and complacent, saying that we can leave this prayer or that confession or the other change in the way we live to tomorrow. Even as we look forward to the tomorrow of the Lord's coming, we must remember that it might be today! (Source: Salford Liturgy).

Safe Recruitment for Volunteers: Diocesan and National Safeguarding Policy requires us to follow certain procedures when recruiting volunteers. For some roles a volunteer must obtain a DBS certificate. For others, while a DBS certificate is not necessary, we are required to obtain and keep on file certain documentation. This includes a basic application form, copies of 3 forms of identification and 2 references. We must obtain this documentation for every current volunteer as well as new volunteers. The volunteers affected include: readers, stewards/welcomers, cleaners, gardeners/grounds helpers, and eucharistic ministers within church. After the Masses today we will be handing out packs for volunteers to take away and complete. *The pack comes with clear instructions!* On December 14th our safeguarding reps will be available from 10am to 1pm in the Committee Room of the Kavanagh Centre to receive completed packs and check ID. **If you already have a DBS certificate because of a parish role you do not need to complete this process as your documentation has already been provided**.

As you may know there is always a surge in demand on foodbanks during school holidays when children don't have access to a hot meal during the day on which many families rely. The most urgent items are longlife milk, fruit juice, sponge puddings, tins of meat (e.g. ham, corned beef), chickpeas, coconut milk, packets of biscuits, shampoo and nappies sizes 7&8. No cereals or pasta, please. Your donations are always much appreciated.

Many thanks for your rapid response to the plea for milk - a couple of gallons were delivered together with the clothing so far. Thank you for all your contributions towards helping people who are without a place to call home.
