Readings this Week: Often we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany on this Sunday and so it is not every year that we have the readings before us today. The Gospel takes us back to the Mass of the Day for Christmas and St John's great prologue in which he gives us a clue as to what he will unpack in the rest of his Gospel: the identity of Jesus, the Word (logos) who became flesh, who was with God in the beginning and who was God. Already in the Old Testament there were hints of this profound truth at the heart of the Christian faith. One example is in the presentation of Wisdom in the first reading. In his great opening to his letter to the Ephesians, St Paul's reflections (our Second Reading) make the plan that comes from God personal to us: "Blessed be the God and Father or our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him." We begin this new year confident and secure that we were chosen before the foundation of the world to contribute to the fulfilment of God's plan.

Marriage Matters: He chose us "to be holy and spotless and to live through love in his presence". 'Holy and spotless'....with all the messiness of our lives...clothes, toys, all over the floor, washing up in the sink? Yes. 'Holy!'...'through loving'. So, whether cleaning up the mess or working to earn money, you are doing loving things. You are 'holier' than you think! (Source: Marriage Care)

Relics of St Carlo Acutis to Visit Diocese of Salford: In January, the relics of St Carlo Acutis will be hosted at two of our churches over five days, during which time the Diocese will welcome schools, parishioners and people from all over for veneration. Carlo is the first millennial saint and is celebrated for his profound faith and his use of the internet to log Eucharistic miracles from around the world. He was passionate about spreading the teachings of the Catholic Church up until his death from leukemia at the age of 15. The relics will be presented at St Mary's Church, Burnley from 28-29 January 2026 before they travel to St Patrick's Church, Collyhurst from 30 January to 1 February 2026.
