All donations during your lifetime qualify for a 33.3% tax rebate up to a limit of your taxable income. If you make a donation of \$5 or more to Health Fund PLUS, you may be able to claim a tax credit of 33.3%. You can claim your donation tax credit online through [myIR.co.nz](http://myIR.co.nz) or you can submit a tax credit claim form - IR526.
