

### What is the Northland Sport Fund?

- In 2016, Sport Northland and the Northland Community Foundation (NCF) established the Northland Sport Fund.
- The distributions of the Kauri Club Fund (a fund under the umbrella of the Northland Sports Fund) has supported the operation of the Kauri Club, which provides talent development support, grants and scholarships to promising young Northland sports people to better prepare them to reach the top of their chosen sports.

2024 Scholarship Recipient (rugby and rugby league)

The financial support has enabled me to purchase new rugby boots, running shoes and has enabled the development of my physical/mental strength with gym and personal programming and physio. The support has also eased the financial pressure on my family by assisting with the payment of fees and travel costs".
