

Local giving for local needs supported by local people.

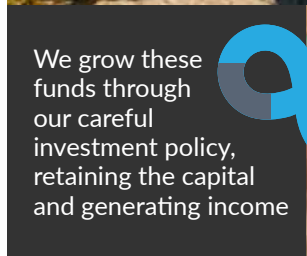

We help ordinary people make an extraordinary difference for Northland by raising funds from donations and legacies



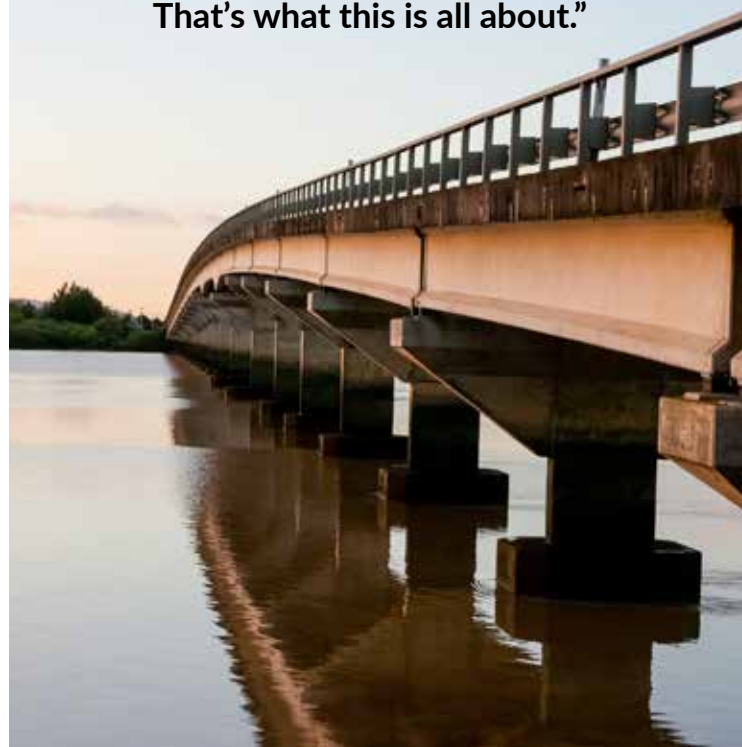
We grow these funds through our careful investment policy, retaining the capital and generating income

What is the Northern Wairoa Fund?

The fund is a constantly growing pool of money that is invested, with the interest annually disbursed to specifically support the District's vision for its people and place. Local people, and anyone with a connection to the area, can contribute to growing the fund, both now and in the future, through a gift in their will.

The interest the fund receives is delivered annually through grants to local groups and organisations who support their community.
