On the interiors, the containers are the most transformed. Bedrooms and living space feature walls of finished panel or veneer, and openings cut into the steel walls are fixed with modern metal windows. But from without, there is no doubt that these are relics from the shipping industry. All the metalcontainers and steel frame - is painted an earthy red/brown, while the new window frames are black. This palette enhances the contrasting greenery and landscape elements of the scheme, charging things up through opposition of hard and soft, natural and industrial.

It is noteworthy that the largest living space is actually the terrace in front of the container. And the most prominent architectural component of Escape Den may be the latticed canopy floating over the top of two-thirds of the house, resting upon the steel beams. Undoubtedly, the containers are the supporting players here: it is the frame in all its robust grandeur that steals the show. But what's wrong with that? Indeed, it is the attitude of the architects to integrate the containers into something larger and let them play more subdued roles in the form of Escape Den, and to the benefit of both frame and box. This integration beyond being simply an eve-catching

Situated amid rural farming plots some distance from neighbouring buildings, Escape Den acts as an urban retreat, a place to get away from the city's dust and chaos and enjoy the salubrious environs nearby, overlooking greenery amid relative quiet. The scheme erects a metal skeleton and then populates it with four shipping containers, leaving spaces and platforms in between. The house operates on four different half-levels, from ground-floor parking bay to top-floor bedrooms. The steel frame, which is left raw and rusty, lifts the main living space just off grade. The plan lays out two principal sides organised across an open space between them... a planted atrium courtyard that will once the vines grow in all round it, become a cool void in the middle of the building. Open staircases crisscross this atrium, climbing up the frame via open ferraces. Above the parking bay is an internal lounge
